




Lending Library open 9-4 pm every day.

ART FOR EVERYONE IN AUGUST

We will be offering a **Beginning Weaving** class in August starting Monday, August 1st. This class will meet each Monday in August in Room 2210 from 11:00-12:00. We will be making our own looms and will learn various weaving techniques. Join us for this fun group time and learn a relaxing new art. <u>Please register with Robin in the Shepherd's Center office by</u> <u>June 30th</u>. Supplies needed for this class are:

Hammer; 3/4" wire nails (approximately 100); Large plastic needle capable of threading yard through and having a blunt end; 12×16 " canvas (we will be removing the canvas and using the frame as our loom, so if you have an old canvas picture this size and want to us it, you can.); A piece of lightweight cardboard cut 12" long and 1 1/2" wide; Ruler; Yarns of various color (any kind); Scissors; A plastic fork; 3/8" dowel (this will be provided for you).
