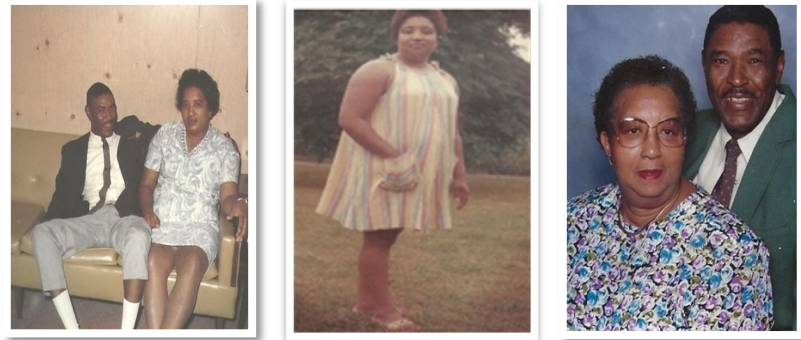

In Memoriam

Doris Elizabeth Morris Shouse was born September 23, 1937 in Stokes County, NC to the late Mr. Lee Morris and Mrs. Margaret Gibson Morris. She was the only girl of six children. A native of Walnut Cove, NC, she received her elementary and secondary education and spent her adult life in the Historic District of the Rural Hall – Bethania Community.
