It's that time of year again! As Spring approaches, it's also nearing Showtime! The warmer weather and greener grass signal the ideal moment to start preparing cattle for the show. Here are some key steps you can implement now:

Train your cow with a halter and show stick: Familiarize your cow with the halter and show stick early on as
they are crucial for guiding your cow during the competition. This will help keep your cow calm throughout
the showing process.

Halter breaking requires patience and practice. Take it slow and avoid rushing the process to build trust and respect with your animal. Developing a bond with your animal takes time, so be gentle, compassionate, and dedicated to teaching your animal to respect the halter.

A show stick is a valuable tool for teaching your animal how to present itself. Ensure the front feet are aligned beneath the shoulders and the hind leg closest to the judge is slightly positioned back. Aim for balance, not stretching out the animal. Be prepared to discreetly and gently reposition its feet during the judging process.


Establish a feed regimen: Proper feed selection and management are essential for getting your cow in the right condition. If choosing the grain method, nutritionists recommend starting a feed regimen 45-60 days before the show, with feed amounting to 2.5-3.0% of body weight and medium-quality grass hay.

• Keep show cattle away from winter mud: Muddy conditions are tough on cattle, causing stress and affecting their health and weight gain. Remove mud and manure balls by washing them with shampoo and warm water a month before the show. Clip the winter coat and train the top line hair to ensure easier management closer to the show date.

By initiating these steps now, you'll set the stage for a successful show day!
