

LITURGY CORNER**May 1 - THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER**

**May 2 - Saint Athanasius, Bishop, Doctor of the Church**

**May 3 - SAINTS PHILIP AND JAMES, APOSTLES**

**Third Sunday of Easter**, Jesus appears to seven of his disciples, among them Peter who proclaims his unfailing love for the Lord. Jesus commissions him to feed the sheep. Later, in the face of persecution, Peter and the apostles proclaim the name of Jesus, the Lamb who was slain and who rescues us from death. (*2022 Ordo*)


**St Athanasius** is one of the four great Doctors of the Eastern Church, he defended the true faith against the Arian heresy, which denied the full divinity of Christ. A devoted bishop in Alexandria, Egypt, for forty-six years, he was repeatedly exiled for his defense of the creed of the Council of Nicaea; he died in 373 and was one of the first non martyrs, or confessors, to be venerated as a saint.

**Saint Philip**, one of the Twelve, a fisherman from Bethsaida, makes the moving request of Jesus, "master, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." In reply, Jesus says, "Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me."

**Saint James** "the Less," one of the Twelve; the son of Alphaeus; two Apostles are named James, this James is believed to be called "the Lesser" because he was called later by Jesus, or shorter in stature, or even younger; tradition considers him the first bishop of Jerusalem.

TODAY'S READINGS

**First Reading** — Brought before the Sanhedrin, the apostles give witness to Jesus Christ. (Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41).

**Psalm** — I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me (Psalm 30).

**Second Reading** — In his vision John sees all in heaven and on earth give honor and glory to the one on the throne and to the Lamb (Revelation 5:11-14).

**Gospel** — Jesus appears to the disciples by the sea of Tiberias (John 21:1-19 [1-14]).

**Brothers and Sisters,**

During this Easter season, forgiveness is a constant theme in our scripture readings. We know Peter had denied Jesus three times and Thomas had not believed the accounts of the disciples meeting with Jesus in the upper room. Having said this, both of them are specifically named in today's gospel as being with Jesus when he appears to the disciples for a third time when he cooks breakfast for them at the Sea of Tiberias. Recognizing the Lord had always proven to be a challenge. However, through today's readings we hear of the apostles unyielding determination to embrace their call to bear witness to Jesus, crucified but raised up by God.



In our first reading the Sanhedrin forbade the apostles to preach in the Lord's name, but they took the reprimand as a badge of honor. Facing the opposition from fellow Jews, they stand firm: "We must obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29). To follow and bear witness to Jesus means to be like the one whom God brought through death to fullness of life.

The second reading presents John's vision of angels and elders praising and worshipping the "Lamb that was slain" who now shares "honor and glory and blessing" with God (Rev. 5:12). The book of Revelation always looks forward to the final completion of God's work of salvation. Revelation fundamentally offers hope for the future-hope rooted in God's saving action in the past and the present.

Today's gospel reading comes from the last chapter of John. John's gospel is full of symbolism. Here it presents the risen Christ's encounter with seven disciples. Seven is a biblical symbol for perfection or completion. Among the seven are Simon Peter, Thomas, Nathanael who initially questioned if anyone coming from Nazareth could be important, James and John the sons of Zebedee who wanted favored seats next to Jesus in the kingdom together with two other disciples. This was a pretty motley crew in the boat that morning. And, once again for a third time none of them recognize Jesus standing on the shore, close enough to be heard. It is not until they make an incredible catch of fish at his direction that any of them recognize him until the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." Jesus goes on to truly reveal himself by breaking bread with them, just as he had done on the night before he died.

This final chapter of John's gospel seems to be trying to sort out some unfinished business between Peter and Jesus. Today we hear the story of Peter's reconciliation and his calling to follow in the Lord's footsteps. Jesus leads Peter back into a loving relationship with him. There is no reminder that Peter had denied Jesus three times, no condemnation. However, Jesus does not let Peter off the hook. The question Jesus asks Peter is a very simple direct question: "Do you love me?" Three times Peter gives the right answer: "Yes, Lord, you know I love you" and three times Jesus asks Peter to care for his flock. Today's gospel tells us that when Peter was asked the question a third time he was "distressed." We might ask: What was he feeling? Embarrassed, mortified, afraid of the elephant in the room so to speak? If by Jesus' question Peter is being asked to confess his guilt, his penance is all the more telling. Proof of his reconciliation will be shown by how he cares for all who will be in his care. So here is my final thought for you today: Our response to Jesus' question, our love for Christ, is seen and given shape in our love for others, especially those in need.

Recognizing the Lord has always proven to be a challenge.





## IGLESIA

El tiempo de Pascua nos ofrece la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre quiénes somos como Iglesia, a la luz de las primeras experiencias de los seguidores de Jesús. Desde el Evangelio de hoy, nos damos cuenta de que todo lo que hacemos se fundamenta en nuestra amistad y confianza en Jesús, como lo atestigua el diálogo de Jesús con Pedro. Desde el Apocalipsis, en la imagen de Jesús como Cordero sacrificado, podemos anticipar el sufrimiento por amor a Dios y a los demás. Del discurso audaz de los apóstoles en los Hechos, recordamos que cuando nos mantenemos fieles al Evangelio, incluso a un gran coste, debemos encarnar siempre el perdón de Dios hacia los que se resisten a la invitación de Dios. La Iglesia primitiva luchó por entender cómo vivir el camino de Jesús, y no podemos esperar menos lucha para nosotros. Y como ellos, también podemos conocer la alegría de una creciente amistad con Dios a lo largo del camino.

## OBEDECER A DIOS

En los primeros capítulos de los Hechos, los apóstoles se aventuran con energía, poco después de Pentecostés, a anunciar a Jesús resucitado. La lectura de hoy muestra al Sanedrín, el cuerpo religioso formal que había condenado a Jesús poco antes, amenazando ahora a los apóstoles. Es probable que el Sanedrín temiera que los seguidores de Jesús, en venganza por la crucifixión, provocaran un motín o incluso una revuelta violenta. Los apóstoles, en consonancia con el trato de Jesús con las autoridades, proclaman el mensaje de Jesús de que Dios perdonaba a todos, y se niegan a incitar a la violencia.

Es un gran desafío, como dijo Pedro, "obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres". A lo largo de la historia, cuando grupos del pueblo de Dios, inspirados por el sueño de Dios de un mundo justo y libre, se han manifestado de forma no violenta contra la injusticia y la opresión, han tratado de obedecer la llamada de Dios. Nosotros, la Iglesia, aunque siempre conscientes de los peligros del autoengaño, estamos igualmente llamados a discernir y obedecer a Dios en nuestro propio tiempo y lugar.

## PREGUNTAS REPETIDAS

En el Evangelio de hoy, Juan prepara la escena del encuentro de Jesús con Pedro, sentado junto a un "fuego de carbón". Sólo hay otra mención de un fuego de carbón en el Evangelio de Juan: cuando Pedro está calentándose mientras espera el juicio de Jesús, y éste niega tres veces conocer a Jesús. El evangelista vincula directamente las tres preguntas de Jesús a Pedro, "¿me amas?", con las tres negaciones de Pedro. A través de sus repetidas preguntas, Jesús ayuda a Pedro a enfrentarse plenamente a sus acciones, y a aceptar también plenamente el perdón.

Cuando Dios nos invita a la oración, podemos ser invitados a entrar en una conversación profunda con Dios sobre nuestras vidas. Dios puede plantearnos las mismas preguntas, una y otra vez a lo largo del tiempo, para enfrentarnos a lo que quizás prefiéramos evitar: ¿Puedes perdonar a alguien que te ha hecho daño? ¿Puedes ser más generoso? ¿Puedes dejar de lado los obstáculos para ser más cariñoso? E incluso: ¿Me amas? El encuentro de Jesús con Pedro sugiere que podemos enfrentarnos a esas preguntas con una profunda confianza en Dios.


**San Atanasio** es uno de los cuatro grandes doctores de la Iglesia de Oriente, defendió la verdadera fe contra la herejía arriana, que negaba la plena divinidad de Cristo. Obispo devoto en Alejandría (Egipto) durante cuarenta y seis años, fue exiliado en varias ocasiones por su defensa del credo del Concilio de Nicea; murió en el año 373 y fue uno de los primeros no mártires, o confesores, en ser venerado como santo.

**San Felipe**, uno de los Doce, un pescador de Betsaida, hace la conmovedora petición a Jesús: "Maestro, muéstranos al Padre y eso nos bastará". En respuesta, Jesús le dice: "Créeme que yo estoy en el Padre y el Padre está en mí".

**San Santiago "el Menor",** uno de los Doce; hijo de Alfeo; dos Apóstoles se llaman Santiago, este Santiago se cree que se llama "el Menor" porque fue llamado más tarde por Jesús, o más bajo de estatura, o incluso más joven; la tradición lo considera el primer obispo de Jerusalén.


