Introduction To The 4G Guide

GATHER – GOD – GROUP – GIVE

It's important that we *GATHER* each week as a church family. Still, God has so much more for us! He wants us to take what He's teaching and apply it to our lives. This is the heart of the 4G Guides. These guides are written to encourage you in your personal *GOD TIME* and in your small *GROUPS*. They are designed to help you understand what God is teaching and apply it to your daily life. Understanding and application allows you to then take what God is teaching and *GIVE* it to others.

Gathering Time

God calls us to corporate worship. On Sunday mornings we gather (in person or online) to worship, hear God's message, and be challenged to apply His word. This booklet includes weekly sermon guides.



God Time

Personal worship is vital to the Christian walk, so we have written five daily devotionals for each weekly topic. This is your time to meet with God one-on-one in a guided devotional format. Once the devotional time is finished, we encourage you to pray, seeking direction for the day.



Group Time

We learn from one another! Each week, either on Sundays or at various other times, 4G Groups meet to dig deeper into the weekly material. This booklet features weekly lesson outlines in a “three-thirds” discipleship format. In addition, links to short video guides, sermon recaps, and other helpful resources are posted on our 4G web page. *



Family Time

Week 3: DANGEROUS PRAYERS – SEND ME

God Time: Day 1 – God Is On His Throne



In the Old Testament, Isaiah was a high-ranking official under the power and authority of King Uzziah. When Uzziah died, Isaiah was in a vulnerable and tenuous position. It was at this point that he had a vision from God that would begin his journey as a prophet. This vision of God's greatness and holiness transformed his way of seeing the world and how he chose to live in it.



Read Isaiah 6:1-4

¹In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" ⁴And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke.

This passage describes one of the most awesome encounters with God's presence anyone in the Bible experienced.

God Time: Day 2 – Humility and Restoration



In addition to seeing God's holy glory, Isaiah's vision led to a deep conviction regarding his own sinfulness. (Any time we truly see God fully, it always reveals where we fall short.) Fortunately, the vision also included God's healing work to take Isaiah's sin/guilt away.



Read Isaiah 6:5-7

⁵And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" ⁶Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."

Describe one time where you became profoundly aware of your need for grace and forgiveness:

God Time: Day 3 – Restoration and Calling



Read Isaiah 5:8

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

After God had cleansed Isaiah from sin, He asks "who will go." In gratitude, Isaiah replies, "Send me".



Have you confessed your flaws before God? If so, in what way(s) did He restore your relationship with Him?



When you were made right, what opportunity, or opportunities, did you take to serve Him? How did you say, "send me"?

God Time: Day 4 – Fear of Being Sent



Jesus told a story about three servants whose master entrusted each of them to watch over his money. The first two invested what they were given and made a profit. For this, the master was greatly pleased. The third decided to bury what he was given so as not to lose any of it. The master was not pleased with his results.



Read Matthew 24:24-26a

²⁴He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, ²⁵so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.' ²⁶But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant!

Circle the action the servant took due to fear.



Think about this: was the servant's fear due to the master's character or to his lack of self-confidence in his own abilities?

You might remember the verse from the children's song, *This Little Light of Mine* that says, "Hide it under a bush – Oh No!"



When we think about God sending us, what do our actions say about our beliefs if we respond in fear? (Are we hiding "under a bush?")

At the very end of the Gospel of Matthew, when Jesus sends His disciples out into the world with a mission, He promises that He will be with them. When we are doing His will, God never leaves us on our own.



In Romans 8, Paul asks, "If God is for us, who can stand against us?"

When we are confident in God's blessing and His power, how should it affect our attitude and response to being sent?



Write your own "Send Me" prayer of availability:

God Times: Day 5 – Going Where God Wants

As we saw in Week 1 of this series, the choices we make and the actions we take reveal the truth about our relationship with God. When we obey, we get closer to God.



Read James 4:8

Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

Isaiah made a choice to be sent based on God's awesomeness and forgiveness. We also have the opportunity to respond to God because of what He has already done for us – even before we know the details of where God will send us and what He will ask of us.

To prepare yourself to follow God's directions at the moment He gives them, here are some suggested actions you can take now:

1. Decide Your Answer Now – make the commitment to obey whatever God tells you to do. (Get in "Yes, God" mode.)
2. Do One Thing A Day That Takes Faith – exercise that habit and stretch yourself. Make it "who" you are.
 - Ask God to speak to you.
 - Share with others what God has already done for you.
 - Volunteer to serve and love others.
3. Look For Opportunities.
 - When someone asks, say "yes."
 - When you feel that tug, go.
 - When you know you can, do!

LOOK BACK:

Point: *God will break you because He loves you and wants to use you. Look forward to it.*

- Review last week's lesson. How did you determine that your brokenness could help others? Did you help someone?

Question: In the children's song, *This Little Light of Mine*, what is the "Light"? What are we not to do with it? What are we supposed to do with it?



LOOK UP: Watch this week's Group Guide video on our 4G web page.

Recap: The third dangerous prayer is "*Send Me!*" from Isaiah 6:8.

Isaiah's vision of the throne room of heaven is pretty awe inspiring and Isaiah quickly learns that when we encounter God's overwhelming goodness, we are overwhelmed with our brokenness. At the same time, when we admit this brokenness, God is quick to forgive. This forgiveness comes, not with a price, but with an expectation – our availability. Availability requires two things: preparation and obedience. Preparation means taking the steps necessary to serve our Lord (Have you gone through all 4-steps of On-Ramp?), obedience means we are willing to say, "yes" whenever, wherever, however, and to whomever He calls us.

LOOK IN: Discussion Questions

- If God said "Yes" to every prayer you prayed this past week, what would be different in this world today? Be specific.
- Share the last thing you did that required faith in God on your part. What happened? What did you learn?
- Read Isaiah 6:1-8. Why does praying "*Send me*" scare you?

LOOK FORWARD: Application

Point: *Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you (James 4:8). Prepare yourself to say, "YES, LORD!"*

- Assess your preparedness and availability to be a "Light" in a dark and dying world. Be honest with yourself. Seek God's appraisal ("*Search Me*"). Ask for help from others. What do you need to do to be available? Do you need training? A partner? A teacher? A student? Make a list and devise a plan of action so you will be ready to say "YES!" when God calls.

Family Time

Main Idea:

Dangerous Prayers... Send Me



Key Verse: Isaiah 6:8

Encourage:

God wants us to listen to Him and follow His voice. But, if we are not listening to what He is saying to us, we will not know what we are to do. God does not scream at us, so we need to take time to stop and listen to hear where He wants to send us.



Challenge:

Sometimes listening to God is just about taking the small steps. Sometimes it could be taking a big step.

Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Hebrews 10:23-25

1. Participants partner-up to ask five short and simple questions. Partners should be of the same gender. If there is an odd number, triplets are OK but need to work swiftly.
2. Partners ask each other these five questions:

	"Did you spend specific personal time in the BIBLE <u>each day</u> this past week?"	These are "Yes" or "No" questions.
	"Did you spend specific time in PRAYER <u>each day</u> this past week? – not just for meals"	Any hesitations or "Well..." responses are circled "No."
	"Did you do something specific to show Godly LOVE to someone this past week?"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If so, the partner briefly shares the encounter(s) with their partner and, on the provided line, writes the name(s) of the person(s) they showed love to, shared the Gospel with, or discipled. • If not, leave the line blank.
	"Did you intentionally share the GOSPEL with anyone this past week?"	
	"Did you DISCIPLE anyone this past week?" (E.g.: Sharing any of the God, Group, or Family Times)	

3. To finish, each partner prays for the other. No matter how or what the partner has done over the past week, this is an intentional prayer of **encouragement**!
