Restoration Project Update



The restoration project continues to move forward. At this point we are looking anxiously toward holding our first service in the new sanctuary. The carpet installation moves forward, electrical work in both the sanctuary and the Educational Building is almost complete, grass has been planted and sidewalks completed. The Cumberland sign is being erected in front of the church.

The pew cushions are being altered to fit and the choir chairs have been moved to the Educational Building to be cleaned and placed into the church at the appropriate time. Restrooms have been completed as well as the sprinkler system and we await the completion of the olumbing hookup in order to test both.

We are emptying the Hut so that it can be demolished. This will allow landscaping, parking and lighting to be completed in the rear of the church. We are also investigating alternate parking lots for use on Sunday mornings.

The Restoration Committee is preparing a list of items that members and friends may want to donate to the church and receive recognition.

The Restoration Committee asks that you remain vigilant and in prayer for the continued success of the project. We also ask that you respond to the call from the Trustee for your help when we begin refurbishing the Educational Building.
