St. John I from Tuscany, served as one of Rome's seven deacons before he was elected to Pope in 523, immediately he was caught in the middle between two rulers over the disagreement of Arian Christians; he was imprisoned and died of ill treatment in 526, he is a martyr for the unity of the church.

St. Bernardine, he entered the Franciscan Friars Minor in 1402; he promoted devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; Patron saint of the Diocese of San Bernardino; he died in 1444.

St. Christopher Magallanes and twenty-one diocesan priests and three laymen were killed for their association with the *Cristero* uprising which opposed the anti-Catholic Mexican government in the 1920s. The Mexican Constitution implemented in 1926 outlawed any public worship outside a church, closed Catholic schools, denied the Church's right to hold property, and made it a crime to dress in clerical garb. The *Cristero* motto was,

"Long live Christ the King and the Virgin of Guadalupe."

Brothers and Sisters,

On his visit to a parish, a bishop decided to test the children's knowledge of the catechism. The kids answered all the bishop's questions. Finally, he asked: "By what sign will people know you are Christians?" Everyone was silent. As he was about to point to the cross that hung around his neck, a little girl said, "Love!" That's what Jesus says. Today Jesus summarizes all the Old Testament laws and commands into one "*new commandment*": "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus goes on to say that it is through love that everyone will know who his disciples are.



One of the most famous songs by the Beatles was written in 1967 for a television program called *Our World*. The title of the song was "All You Need Is Love." Over 400 million people from twenty-five countries tuned in to watch. The Beatles had been asked for a song that people of every nation could understand, which was and is why the lyrics are simple and repetitive: "All you need is love, love. Love is all you need..."

The song's writer, John Lennon, was not the first to offer that message to the world. Almost two thousand years earlier, another John had spoken similar words to the Christians of his time. He was St. John the Evangelist, who is believed to have been the author of today's second reading from Revelation and the Gospel. Tradition says St. John lived to be very old. However, with age came both physical frailty and weakness in his voice. Because other people thought of him as the last living link with Jesus, they would beg him for just a few words. So, from his bed he would raise himself up and say to them: "little children, love one another!" Each time he was asked to say something, it was always this same message. After a while people would ask, "Teacher, why do you always say this?" St. John would reply, "Because the Lord commanded it, and if you keep that commandment, even if you do nothing else, it is sufficient."

Jesus calls today's gospel commandment his "new" commandment, even though there was already one very much like it, for it was a requirement of the Jewish Law to love your neighbor as yourself. This new commandment, however, went much further. Jesus was asking his followers, not just to treat people as they themselves would like to be treated, but to treat people kindly regardless of the cost to themselves. To love as Jesus loved was to love the unlovable; to forgive the unforgivable; to keep loving and forgiving, whether or not it might be reciprocated. Then as now the "new commandment" means reaching out to the marginalized and stigmatized, welcoming home the sinner, feeding those who are hungry and caring for those who are sick.

The Lord is still commanding us, his disciples, to go beyond the social norms of our day; to treat people well, whoever they are, even if it creates difficulties for ourselves. We need not worry what other people will think, in God's eyes we appear not foolish, but glorious.

My personal intercession for each of us is: That by our love for one another, everyone may know that we are Christ's disciples.


Miracle attributes her success to her mother, saying, "I owe all of this to her!" "It was tough, but with the help of the Almighty God, we pulled through," she wrote.





GLORIFICAR A DIOS

En la primera frase del pasaje del Evangelio de hoy de Juan, el discurso de Jesús en la Última Cena, las palabras “glorificar” o “glorificado” aparecen cinco veces. Para Juan, la gloria tiene que ver con el honor y la reputación, la característica principal de una persona. Así, Juan nos invita a reflexionar sobre lo que significa plenamente la gloria de Dios. Dios es glorificado cuando se revela su naturaleza más verdadera, como el Dios que ama. El pasaje de hoy se sitúa entre dos demostraciones del amor de Jesús: el lavatorio de los pies y el paso por la cruz. La capacidad de glorificar a Dios se extiende a todos nosotros. Como Jesús, el amor se revela tanto en nuestros actos mundanos de servicio como en nuestros actos y compromisos de gran sacrificio. El “mandamiento nuevo” de Jesús, que brota del amor de Dios en nosotros, nos invita a extender y profundizar nuestro amor por los demás, para incluir a todos. Así podemos revelar a todos la verdadera naturaleza de Dios y glorificar a Dios.

HECHO EL UNO PARA EL OTRO

En la segunda lectura se nos presenta la gran visión final del libro del Apocalipsis. La culminación del proyecto de salvación de Dios se describe como una nueva Jerusalén que viene del cielo, para formar un cielo nuevo y una tierra nueva. La imagen de un matrimonio articula esta visión, en la que las dos partes de la buena creación de Dios, la tierra y el cielo, se unen en una unión final. La tierra (el universo físico) no se destruirá, sino que se renovará por completo.

Esta visión rechaza cualquier noción de que lo físico y lo espiritual están en última instancia separados y opuestos entre sí. Rechaza la idea de que el cielo sea una escapatoria de la prisión de la vida terrenal. Al igual que un matrimonio, estas dos partes de la realidad están hechas fundamentalmente la una para la otra. La vida en el cielo y la vida en la tierra son muy diferentes ahora. Pero la vida de fe, aquí y ahora, ofrece un anticipo del futuro prometido por Dios.

TODAS LAS COSAS NUEVAS

El cielo nuevo cielo y la tierra nueva descritos por el Apocalipsis es donde Dios habitará plenamente entre su amada creación. El reino de Dios será un reino de amor, donde la muerte ya no existirá. En el Apocalipsis, la muerte alimenta el miedo y el resentimiento, que se convierten en ciclos de violencia y destrucción, y en sistemas sociales que mantienen la injusticia. Estos ciclos de muerte se romperán un día por el amor. En el reino de amor de Dios, se podrán liberar nuevas energías de creatividad y realización humana.

Cuando Dios dice “he aquí que hago nuevas todas las cosas”, está hablando tanto del presente como del futuro. Dios está trabajando ahora, en cada persona y comunidad, en cada parte de la creación, para llevar a cabo esta nueva realidad. 15 de mayo - QUINTO DOMINGO DE PASCUA

18 de mayo - San Jun I, Papa y mártir

20 de mayo - San Bernardino de Siena, presbítero

21 de mayo - Santos Cristóbal Magallanes, presbítero, y compañeros, mártires

San Juan I de Toscana, sirvió como uno de los siete diáconos de Roma antes de ser elegido Papa en 523, inmediatamente se vio atrapado en medio de dos gobernantes por el desacuerdo de los cristianos arrianos; fue encarcelado y murió de malos tratos en 526, es un mártir de la unidad de la iglesia

San Bernardino, ingresó en los frailes menores franciscanos en 1402; promovió la devoción al Santo Nombre de Jesús; patrón de la diócesis de San Bernardino; murió en 1444.

San Cristóbal Magallanes y veintiún sacerdotes diocesanos y tres laicos fueron asesinados por su asociación con el levantamiento cristero que se opuso al gobierno mexicano anti-católico en la década de 1920. La Constitución mexicana implantada en 1926 prohibía cualquier culto público fuera de una iglesia, cerraba las escuelas católicas, negaba el derecho de la Iglesia a tener propiedades y convertía en delito vestirse con ropa clerical. El lema cristero era:

"Viva Cristo Rey y la Virgen de Guadalupe".
