

VEDA'S MARKET BASKET

Double Wall Cherokee Basket September 18, 2025 9:30 am — 3:00 pm **Sparks Masonic Center**

Instructor: Janelle Raabe

Double wall basketry is a hallmark of Cherokee culture and tradition. The double wall adds strength to the basket, many baskets were originally woven from river cane, honeysuckle and white oak. The basket begins with weaving the inner wall from a central round start. Once the inner wall's height is reached the spokes are turned downward to weave the outer wall of the basket. The finished edge at the bottom creates a rim or foot for the basket to rest on. The basket can be woven with either #2 or #3 round reed.


