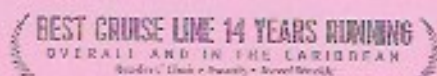

Many of Baltimore's attractions are concentrated around the Inner Harbor, the original, rehabilitated seaport. Nearby are Federal Hill, a historic neighborhood, and Mount Vernon, the city's cultural center and home to top museums

### **San Juan, Puerto Rico**

Puerto Rico's vibrant capital, San Juan, offers 500 years of history and culture to explore. Roam ancient fortresses and colorful colonial-era buildings. Or dig into flavorful criolla cuisine and reggaeton beats – the city is a kaleidoscope of new experiences waiting to be discovered.

### **Philipsburg, St. Maarten**

St. Maarten sits at the crossroads of the Caribbean and the Atlantic. It's also a place where over 120 cultures meet. You can taste it in the island's cuisine, which is rated among the best in the Caribbean. And you can feel it whether you stay in the upbeat, party-centric Dutch side where the port is located, or cross into the laid-back, local-driven French side of the island.

### **Castries, St. Lucia**

And be sure to soak in the natural wonders – whether it be the hot mineral pools or the Sulphur springs that are heated by the dormant volcano of Soufriere.

### **Basseterre, St. Kitts & Nevis**
