* * Information re: the new album "EMOTION"!

Due to the importance of the release of the upcoming new album "EMOTION", Juice will not be touring extensively until fall. Since the first of the year, Juice has necessarily been keeping a low profile, due first, to the birth of Jessica Ann, and shortly thereafter, her two weeks stay in the hospital as a result of the back injury she suffered when her horse threw her, (and her recovery and adjustment period after her hospital stay). Then, in middle May, Juice attended Fan Fair in Nashville, so the production and release of the album has been delayed far beyond what was first anticipated.

Her management has told us the album should be released sometime during August. A tour schedule is not ready at this time

to include with this newsletter. (Hopefully, in our September newsletter, we will have some tour information for you).

The first single from the LP "EMOTION", titled "First Time Caller" has been released to radio stations and is getting airplay now. The single has not reached the radio stations in our area yet, but you might check with your favorite D.J.'s and ask them if they've received it.

We know this information is a disappointment to a lot of you, because your letters have indicated you can hardly wait until the album is released, but maybe you can take comfort in knowing it won't be long until it will be in the marketplace!

REVIEW

Since we have no reviews for this newsletter, due to the fact the album hasn't been released, we decided to share with you a very special review we have kept since 1983. Hope you enjoy it!

A Classic Review

Published in the Tallahassee Democrat, April 1983, written by MARC BROWN.

"ALABAMA WAS SWEET, BUT NEWTON WAS JUICIER!

"The group Albama showed a wet, but enthusiastic crowd at the Civic Center Friday night why they're the hottest-selling set in country music today.

But for sheer excitement, there was no beating Juice Newton's show - the meat in a three-part musical sandwich that also included a surprisingly good, but short, set by the Thrasher Bros.

To bend the title of one of Newton's biggest songs, just call her

Angel of the Evening.
While Alabama and the Thrashers may have made concertgoers wish they were from the Heart-of-Dixie state, Juice left them wishing they could go home with her.

Her well-paced, hour-long set of rockers and ballads was clearly the **high** point of an evening **full of highs**, and made even the best country front-runners Alabama had to offer, seem slightly pale in comparison.

That's not to say Alabama wasn't good. They were great! The band's lengthy set of double and triple-platinum songs kept the crowd of 10,872 clapping, stomping and cheering until the very end \dots but for every act on the road today, there's at least one night it can call it's own, and Friday night belonged to Juice Newton.

She bathed the crowd in the pureness of her voice — a voice that cut through the darkness of the Civic Center like a sword and could double for a diamond cutter if it had to.

And her's was the liveliest of the three sets. Spirited onstage dancing by Alabama's show was no match for the dancing, skipping and spinning Newton herself did during her performance.

Backing her up was an excellent band led by guitarist and long time collaborater, Otha Young, who with Chuck Martin, the band's other guitarist, filled the gaps between Newton's words with some of the most stinging, yet pleasing, runs possible in the country-

Even though they were upstaged Friday night, Alabama can take heart. There are 29 dates left on their tour with Newton, and countrymusic fans all over the country can look forward to some monumental battles of the bands between now and next fall.

SONGWRITER'S SHOWCASE - OTHA YOUNG AND FRIENDS (Following are excerpts from an article written by Robert Oermann, Staff Writer for The Tennessean, Nashville, TN., 6-4-87)

"JUICE NEWTON Sidekick YOUNG Sweats Out Solo Debut Show"

OTHA YOUNG has been peforming throughout America for more than 15 years, but this time he's scared. "I'm real nervous," the singer/songwriter said during a telephone interview this week. "This is the first time I've played Nashville on my own." The occasion is Young's showcase at **The Bluebird Cafe**, Thursday night, at which he'll be making his **solo Music City debut**. He's been seen on Nashville stages before, but his prior appearances have been as the guitarist, bandleader, harmony singer, co-producer, songwriter and tour coordinator for country/pop star Juice Newton. Young is perhaps best known as the composer of "The Sweetest Thing", Newton's first No. 1 country hit and a top-10 pop smash that sold more than 800,000 singles. It was included on the star's 1981 platinum record album JUICE. Among the 35 other Otha Young songs that have been recorded during the past decade are Dickey Lee's top-20 country success "Love is a Word", the 1982 pop-hit by The Carpenters "Sweet, Sweet Smile" and Newton's top-10 country hit of last year "What Can I Do With My

In the 1980's, Young became associate producer of Newton's records with Richard Landis, and this is when the **big hits began coming.** He is still associate producer of Juice's albums and remains her **professional partner**. Young has two new songs on Newton's forthcoming LP, but he's interested in spreading his songwriting renown. "I'm showcasing because I'm interested in finding an aggressive publisher in Nashville.'

The show will feature duets with **Johnny Pierce**, the songwriter of Kathy Mattea's 1986 hit, "**He Won't Give In**". Pierce has been the **bass player in Newton's band for the past four years** so he and Young have sung together before. "We're both nervous, so we're doing a couple of tunes as a duet." "Chris Wall has yet to have any songs recorded, but I think that's a temporary situation. He's a colorful writer and a strong singer. His songs are deeply reflective, intelligent views of American life," says Young.

FOOTNOTE: The SHOWCASE was a big success and we've been told Juice 'WOWED' the audience!!
