MONDAY, May 13, 2024

4:30 am Indiana (Wal-Mart, near Rita's Italian Ice)
4:45 am Clymer (Tate's, last row of employee lot)

5:15 am Northern Cambria (Bi-Lo)

5:45 am Ebensburg (Community College / Big Lots parking lot)

Please arrive 15 minutes prior to departure. Parking is at your own risk and we do not recommend leaving your car for the duration of the trip. Call if you'd like to change your pick up location.

7:15 am

Breakfast stop (McDonalds and Pilot) Lamar Exit of I-80

Fast food and rest stops en route

5:00 pm. Approximate arrival to Hyannis, Massachusetts. Welcome to the sandy shores of CAPE COD.

Extending some 70 miles into the sea, the Cape is home to both natural beauty and quaint colonial villages.

You can walk pristine beaches, revel in the arts and culture, and reclaim childhood memories of seashells, sandcastles, and saltwater taffy. Your LOCAL GUIDE will meet you at the BAYSIDE RESORT and will assist with check in.

DINNER is included this evening at your resort.

TUESDAY, MAY 14, 2024

7:00 AM EXTENDED CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST is included this morning at your hotel.

8:30 AM

Your LOCAL GUIDE will meet you at your hotel for a full day of touring. You will travel historic ROUTE 6A, the Old King's Highway, a scenic byway winding through centuries of Cape Cod history. It winds past hundreds of historic structures which characterize its early development. View a Windmill, a Cape Cod Lighthouse and visit the CAPE COD NATIONAL SEASHORE VISITOR'S CENTER. Sand dunes and the ocean surround you as you approach "Land's End" — PROVINCETOWN. You are now at the extreme tip of Cape Cod. Formerly known as the "Province Lands" the pilgrims landed here first before they decided to settle across the Bay in Plymouth. Take some time to enjoy the wonderful variety of restaurants, shops, and galleries that make this artists/fishermen village so unique.

2:00 PM

Board an excursion vessel for an amazing experience of WHALE WATCHING. (3 hours) You will travel into the natural habitat of a diverse marine environment including birds that migrate here from all over the Atlantic, and fish which use these shallow waters to feed. Try to spot Humpback, Minke, and Fin Whales going about their daily business. An onboard naturalist will introduce you to everything you see and will answer any of your questions about the whales, birds, fish and lighthouses.

OR YOU MAY CHOOSE TO STAY ON DRY LAND:

Admission is included on a one-hour DUNE TOUR. Ride along the shoreline of the protected lands of the Cape Cod National Seashore. Your guide will point out the "dune shacks" where famous artists and writers became inspired to create their art.

DINNER is included this evening.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 15, 2024

7:00 AM EXTENDED CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST is included this morning at your hotel.

Your LOCAL GUIDE will meet you at your hotel and you will travel to the "south side" of the Cape to the seaside village of CHATHAM. You will view the CHATHAM LIGHT, which has been a lifesaving beacon for sailors throughout the Cape's history. Chatham's location at the Cape's "elbow" makes it very vulnerable to winter storms and your guide will point out the CHATHAM BREAK and the dramatic changes to the shoreline that have occurred, thanks to Mother Nature.

Admission is included to visit the ATWOOD HOUSE MUSEUM. Built in the 1750's by Joseph Atwood, a Chatham Sea Captain, the "Old House" was occupied for five generations. The museum is a vibrant institution showcasing eleven galleries and a working Fresnel lantern from one of the historic Chatham Twin Lights.

Next, travel to HYANNIS where your guide will conduct a tour including the John F. Kennedy Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, Hyannis port and a view of St. Francis Xavier Church, the summer parish of the Kennedy Family.

Visit the CAPE COD MARITIME MUSEUM where the Cape and Islands maritime past, present and future is celebrated. Experience our inspiring passion and respect for the sea and how it continues to shape Cape Cod. Experience our maritime traditions and nautical history.

DINNER is included this evening.

THURSDAY, MAY 16, 2024

7:00 AM EXTENDED CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST is included this morning at your hotel.

Check out.

8:30 AM

Your LOCAL GUIDE will meet you at your hotel and you will travel to America's Hometown – PLYMOUTH. Home of our Pilgrim Fathers and one of the country's first settlements, it is well known in the United States for its historical value. A picture stop will be made at the Forefather's Monument, the largest, solid granite monument in the United States. She stands facing the harbor, welcoming those who come by water. A picture stop will also be made at Plymouth Rock, the traditional site of disembarkation of the Pilgrims in 1620. View the newly restored Mayflower II, a reproduction of the ship that brought the Pilgrims to the New World. Lunch on own on the Plymouth Waterfront.

Bid farewell to your Cape Cod guide and travel to the CITY OF BOSTON, the capital of, and largest city in Massachusetts. It is one of the oldest cities in the United States. As the largest city in New England, Boston is regarded as the unofficial "Capital of New England" for its economic and cultural impact on the entire New England region.

Meet your LOCAL GUIDE at the Surface Artery. Boston is the city where America's roots were formed and driving through it is like reading the pages of an American history book. Your guide will point out sights along the Freedom Trail as well as the Boston Common and Public Gardens, the Back Bay, Beacon Hill, and the gold-domed State House.

DINNER is included this evening in Boston.

Check into the COURTYARD BY MARRIOTT WOBURN for a two-night stay.

FRIDAY, MAY 17, 2024

BREAKFAST is included this morning at your hotel.

Your LOCAL GUIDE will meet you at your hotel and you will travel to Salem for a day of touring. Your guide will give you commentary about Salem as you travel into town and as you travel from place to place.

Admission is included to visit the HOUSE OF THE SEVEN GABLES. In 1668 Captain John Turner built a house that has become one of the most famous structures in American history. This home inspired author Nathaniel Hawthorne to write his famous novel *The House of Seven Gables*. You will tour the house in a light and informative manner. See the changes in the building from its beginning days to its mature days of grandeur and splendor. There is a secret staircase and more.

You will have 3 ½ hours of free time for lunch and shopping. Your guide will offer suggestions.

Admission is included to visit the SALEM WITCH MUSEUM. "You are there. Witness the testimony of the hysterical girls, the suffering of the blameless victims, and the decisions of the fanatical judges who sent innocent people to their deaths. When the witch hunt began no one was safe from being accused. This presentation is based on actual trial documents. With 13 stage sets, you'll enter the web of lies and intrigue of the Salem Witch Hunt, one of the most enduring true stories in American History." *Excerpt taken from Salem Witch Museum brochure*.

DINNER is included this evening at a local restaurant.
