





ENF programs receive funding boost with 2022-23 budget

In February, the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees approved a total budget of \$42.5 million-including \$39.8 million for program services-for the 2022-23 fiscal year: a 7% increase from the 2021-22 budget.

The Foundation's largest program, the Community Investments Program, offers one of the most direct ways for Elks to build stronger communities. The CIP now offers \$15.7 million in grants. Beacon Grants, available to every Lodge, are now worth \$4,000, and a third bonus was added to the \$2,000 Gratitude Grant, which is available to Lodges that Gratitude Grant.
