Marship



Stewardship 2021

*Part of our income during the first half of the year came from specific places or can only be used for specific uses. In April we received our second amount (\$20,932) from the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP.) In May we received our final grant amount (\$15,910.00) from the 787 Collective that is designated to be used towards engaging young adults through creative ventures that deepen love for God, self and others. In June we received the Better Together Grant money (\$8,500) from Mission Presbytery that will be used for the Young Adult program to be launched this fall in collaboration with John Knox Ranch and others.







*A reminder - these numbers include the added funds of \$45,342 that are "abnormal" to a traditional year. See the image below for what our income would look like without these funds.


