## Section 5: Genealogy Reading: Laws of England

In the 1800s when an African slave would escape the colony, their destination would be anywhere there was Spanish rule. The rule proved, that if an African was in fact able to escape a colony connected with a Sea Island, it was understood that the African would be able to obtain freedom. However, there was a catch. Africans, who wanted freedom, had to convert from their religion and become Roman Catholic. Africans who did not want to convert, but wanted freedom, chose to settle among Native Americans (Creek and Seminole).






