"Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." *Matthew 9:35-39* (NRSV)

"To share the story of Jesus and invite all people into it."

The weather is cooling, the leaves are just starting to change color and the bounty of the fields is beginning to roll in. Our agricultural loved-ones are hard at work reaping what they have sown earlier in the year, while we all benefit from their labors.

That's kind of what it's like when we think about the blessings of being part of a community-of-faith. In 1st Corinthians 3, Paul writes the following: "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building."

Our common purpose as members of RUCC is rooted in the Core Values, Mission and Vision statements we have adopted. And, of course, as quoted at the beginning of this article, the third point in our Mission statement is that we are to share our faith ("disciples making disciples" as the Core Values statement puts it). Everyone of us who is fortunate enough to know about Jesus Christ, call him "Lord", and enjoy the gifts of the church-family is so because someone else first introduced us to the faith. Some were parents and grandparents who have "gone home to glory", and others were/are friends who still nourish our spirits and relationships with GOD to this day. Regardless, there really isn't a way to "pay them back", but we most certainly can (and should) "pay it forward". This isn't just an ethical stance, it is also a practical need —for the life and future of Christianity and our congregation.

However (before anyone feels overwhelmed or incapable of practicing evangelism "the right way"), I'd encourage you to reflect on this famous quote from Oswald Chambers: "When our Lord said to the disciples, 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men", His reference was not to the skilled angler, but to those who use the drag-net--something which requires practically no skill; the point being that you do not have to watch your 'fish,' but you have to do the simple thing and God will do the rest." In this same vein, I'm very fond of how our Consistory phrased the call to proclaim our faith and fulfill The Great Commission: SHARE and INVITE. How much simpler could it be?

People love and need stories. We have the most important one in the world to tell. Folks are longing for meaning, purpose, and connection (but don't want to be forced into anything). We don't have to harangue, cajole, or bully; we need only extend an offer.

So, I invite everyone of us to invite someone else to enjoy the rich harvest of GOD's Goodness in Christ —a crop yielded for us, not by our own hands, but through the efforts of those who went before us. And if we all continue sharing the gifts and testimonies of our own faith journeys, then the next generation will keep reaping and sowing (just as The Church has been doing for 2,000 plus years).

<u>SPIRITUAL LIFE</u>: Written report submitted. <u>PASTOR'S TIME</u>: Written report submitted.

<u>OLD BUSINESS</u>: We received a quote from Pitt's Fire to remove the existing fire suppression system and install a range guard UL-300 compliant fire suppression system. We also received a quote from Wood Electric for the electrical portion of installation and a quote from Brad Bonsky Heating, Cooling & Sheet Metal Co. to fabricate the stainless steel curtain needed for the kitchen hood. The total for everything is \$4,000. Bonnie Willis is going to follow up this week and ask for a variance from the fire department since we do not have any grease laden vapors and we do not fry any food in the kitchen.

<u>NEW BUSINESS:</u> Debby Tryon made a motion and Nancy Jedel 2nd the motion to test the church water for bacteria, lead, nitrates and nitrites. The total cost is \$117 but we have a donation to cover the cost. Motion passed. Bonnie Willis proposed quarterly leadership meetings starting October 12th. There is a building request by Dar Dorsey to use the patio room for 6 weeks on Tuesday nights for a bible study group. Larry Bates made a motion to allow her to use the room and Elizabeth Whitaker 2nd the motion. Motion passed. Discussed organizing a church golf outing or possibly Frisbee golf on the church grounds.


