New Scrip App on Phones: We recently found out you can get the RaiseRight scrip app on your smartphone and can set-up an account linked to Our Savior so you can purchase scrip anytime, anywhere! You need to set-up your own RaiseRight account by going to www.raiseright.com, and click on the 'Sign Up' button in the upper right corner. The enrollment code for Our Savior is 2192CC663845. This code will link your RaiseRight account to our church account so that the rebates (percentage back) goes to the church. After you

enter the enrollment code, you just follow the prompts to complete setting up your account. Then you can download the RaiseRight app on your phone, and sign into it using the same user name and password you set up on your RaiseRight account.

Scrip cards are a wonderful way to support the youth of our congregation. There are lots of different scrip cards on-hand and they make great gifts as well as regular "shopping" cards for groceries, fuel, and other items. Please purchase scrip after worship on Sundays or from Sara during the week in the office.
