The Parable of the Householder

MATTHEW 13:52

Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old.

- A "scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven" is a writer who is a student of the kingdom of heaven.
- 2. The immediate application of this parable refers to the <u>five</u> men standing there who would <u>write</u> portions of the New Testament.

- 3. The parable also applies to anyone who <u>teaches</u> others about the kingdom of heaven.
- 4. Jesus wants His <u>teachers</u> to always be <u>students</u> of the kingdom of heaven.
- 5. Christ's <u>student/teachers</u> are to be teaching what they are learning.
- 6. When you are a student/teacher for Christ, there will always be <u>new</u> things to learn and teach.
- 7. The teacher is the spiritual head-of-household; his job is to meet the <u>spiritual needs</u> of his students.
- 8. Christ's student/teachers learn and teach Christ's truths as treasures.
- 9. Christ's student/teachers can always find new <u>ways</u> to teach the same basic truths.
