The Parable of the Householder

MATTHEW 13:52

Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old.

1. A “*scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven*” is a writer who is a student of the kingdom of heaven.
2. The immediate application of this parable refers to the five men standing there who would write portions of the New Testament.

<u>Matthew</u>	<u>John</u>	<u>James</u>
<u>Peter</u>	<u>Jude</u>	
3. The parable also applies to anyone who teaches others about the kingdom of heaven.
4. Jesus wants His teachers to always be students of the kingdom of heaven.
5. Christ’s student/teachers are to be teaching what they are learning.
6. When you are a student/teacher for Christ, there will always be new things to learn and teach.
7. The teacher is the spiritual head-of-household; his job is to meet the spiritual needs of his students.
8. Christ’s student/teachers learn and teach Christ’s truths as treasures.
9. Christ’s student/teachers can always find new ways to teach the same basic truths.
