WHEREAS, it has become necessary to amend and renumber certain parts and provisions of the laws, ordinances and regulations of the Harrisburg Park District;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that Chapter 1, Chapter 2 and Chapter 3 of the Harrisburg Park District Code are hereby created as follows:

INTRODUCTION TO CHAPTERS 1 AND 2 OF THE PARK DISTRICT CODE

The rules and regulations contained in Chapters 1 and 2 of the Harrisburg Park District Code are intended to ensure the use and enjoyment of all Park District facilities. It is the intention of the Harrisburg Park District Board of Commissioners that not only will these ordinances be enforced but that all appropriate provisions of state criminal law, especially those related to the use of drugs, liquor or weapons, be enforced by Harrisburg Park District Police. The ordinances contained in Chapters 1 and 2 are in no way intended to take the place of provisions of state, municipal or county law otherwise intended to ensure the safety and good conduct of any person making use of Park District facilities.

CHAPTER 1 PARK RULES REGULATING THE ADMINISTRATION OF PARKS AND PARK FACILITIES

Section 1.01 Advertising

No person shall display any placard or advertisement of any kind in any park, no shall any person distribute, cast, throw, or place any handbill, pamphlet, circular, advertisement or notice of any kind, nor post, stencil, or otherwise affix any notice or bills, advertisements or other papers upon any structure or thing in or about any park, except as herein provided.

Section 1.02 Fights- Disorderly Conduct

- (a) No person within the limits of the Harrisburg Park District or its playerounds shall engage in, instigate, cause or proure any prize fight, dog fight cock fight or any public or private fighting.
- No person shall do any act in such unreasonable manner as to alarm or disturb another and to provoke a breach of the peace while within property of the Harrisburg Park District.

Section 1.03 Parades and Meetings

No person or persons shall hold or participate in any procession, public meeting gathering or parade within the park system without having first obtained person to do so from the Board of Commissioners.

Section 1.04 Use of Boats on Park Waters

- (a) No person shall launch, operate, manage, or use or place a boat suitable for the carrying or transporting of a person or persons upon any body of water under the jurisdiction or control of the Harrisburg Park District without the express consent of the Park Board.
- (b) Any boat, as above defined, which may be found on any body of water under jurisdiction and control of the Harrisburg Park District, contrary to paragraph (a) of this Ordinance, may be confiscated by the Harrisburg Park District.

Section 1.05 Closing Hours

The parks of the District shall be closed from 11:00 o'clock P.M. prevailing time in the evening untildaybreak the following morning, except in parks having lighted athletic facilities and in neighborhood or community recreation centers whose facilities are specifically in use and under the control of the Recreation Division of the District, or with the express consent of the Park Board No person or property of any kind shall remain in the parks after closing time unless permission has been granted by the Park Board for later hours.

Section 1.06 Concessions

- (a) The Park Board shall engage competent people to take charge of all sales in parks so designated, such as the tennis courts and parks in which special activities are scheduled.
- (b) The Park Board shall enter into a contract with such people handling concessions, describing the terms of this agreement in detail.

Section 1.07 Food Service Facilities -- Health Regulations

The following regulation shall be strictly adhered to:

- 1. All equipment and facilities used in the preparation and service of food per beverage shall be kept in good clean condition.
 - 2. All personnel shall wear clean outer garments used for no other purpose.
 - 3. All personnel shall wear head covering.
 - 4. No person shall work while suffering any communicable disease.
 - 5. Hands shall be washed afer toilet and each absence from kitchen.
 - 6. Spitting and the use of tobacco are prohibited where food is prepared.
 - 7. There shall be minimum manual contact with food and drink, and proper mandling of dishes and utensils, to prevent contamination and possibility of food-borne disease.

- 8. No street clothin shall be stored in kitchen.
 - 9. All food used shall be clean and prepared safely for human consumption.
- 10. Dishes and utensils, before being stored away, shall be thoroughly washed with soap and detergent, rinsed and then sanitized in hot water of at least 170F.
 - 11. All general rules pertaining to sanitation shall be observed.
- Section 1.08 Organization Picnics and Meetings
- (a) No public meeting shall be held in any of the parks under the jurisdiction of the Harrisburg Park District unless a permit is first secured from the Park Board.
- (b) Factory organizations, church organizations, and other large groups or societies shall be allowed to reserve areas in certain parks if a permit for that purpose is issued by the Park Board and said large groups and societies may operate their own concession stands to help defray expenses but not for profit to the organization or to any individual. Entertainment features may also be provided by said organizations to their own people, but no charge shall be made therefor in any of the public parks, and rights to use the parks under permits granted by the Park Board are subject to the use thereof by the public at all times.
- (c) There shall be no sale, collection or punching of admission tickets to any of the shelters, pavilions or other facilities provided in the parks under the jurisdiction of the Harrisburg Park District and no soliciting or collection of money for the use of any of said facilities. There shall be no advertising, either printed or otherwise, to the effect that any group has the exclusive use of shelters, pavilions, or other facilities, and any group which has been granted a permit to use any of said facilities shall stop its activities in bad weather and share said shelters, pavilions and other facilities with the public. The Board of Commissioners of the Harrisburg Park District alone shall have the power to make and enforce charges for the use of the facilities of said Park District.

Section 1.09 Play classes and Camps

- (a) No person or organization shall bring or cause to be brought into the park system any play class, day camp or other organized group of any kind, organized group of any kind, organized for profit, except into facilities of the District where each person entering must pay a daily admission commensurate with the admission charged to individuals of that age, and with express permission of the Park Board.
- (b) Not-for-profit agency day comps, play classes or organized groups may use facilities of the park system when not in conflict with the Park District recreational program, with the express consent of the Park Board.

Section 1.10 Camping

No person shall be permitted to stop and camp in parks of the Harrisburg Park District. (Except when directed by the Park Board.)

Section 1.11 Weapons, Missiles and Fireworks

No person or organization shall bring, carry, or use in any way knives, firearms, or other weapons of any kind, or any fireworks or other explosive substance of any kind into the park system without the permission of the Park Board. No person shall throw, cast, or shoot arrows, stones, or other missiles of any kind within the park system except at such places and times as the District may designate for such purposes.

Section 1.12 Park and Recreation Fees

The Park Board may fix and collect reasonable fees for the use of park facilities. Such fees may be fixed at a uniform rate to all users of such facility or facilities, or the Board may in its discretion, fix such fees at a lower rate for resident users than the rate charged for the use of the same facility or facilities to nonresidents. A "resident user" is hereby defined as a user of park facility or facilities who either resides, or owns real estate within the Harrisburg Park District.

Section 1.13 Miscellaneous Rules

- (a) No person shall hawk, peddle or sell or attempt to hawk, peddle or sell any goods, wares or merchandise of any kind or nature within said parks or playgrounds without first having obtained the permission of the Park Board to do so.
- (b) Picnics may be held in such parts of the parks as shall be designated for that purpose and portions of the parks may be set apart for tennis, golf, ball, croquet and other games, subject to such regulations as may be made by the Board; and no person shall join any such picnics or games without the consent of the persons of whom they are composed, or in any manner disturb or interfere with the same.
- (c) All persons are herby prohibited from practicing and playing golf upon the playgrounds or parks of the Harrisburg Park District except on areas as may be designated by the Park Board of the District.

Section 1.14 Trucks

No person not having business in the Park District system shall drive any vehicle having a gross weight of 10,000 lbs. or more upon any of the parks of the District without first having obtained the consent of the Park Board.

Section 1.15 Parking Lots

No person shall park any vehicle in parking lots of the District beyond the normal closing hour of the park system at 11,000 p.m. except where an individual

is attending a function where permission has been granted for a later closing hour by the Park Board and specified therein.

Section 1.16 Ordinances

All public ordinances of all municipalities within which any part of the Harrisburg Park District is located are hereby adopted by Harrisburg Park District insofar as the same are applicable to, and not in conflict with these ordinances, for the regulation of the use of that portion of the parks and park facilities of Harrisburg Park District located within the territorial limits of such respective municipalities. Said municipal ordinances within that portion of the Park District located within said respective municipalities shall be deemed to be in addition to the provisions of these ordinances.

Section 1.17 Gambling

No person or organization shall engage in gambling or any gambling-related activity within the Harrisburg Park District.

Gambling for purposes of the above includes the following:

- (1) A game of chance or skill for money or for other thing of value unless otherwise declared legal by the laws of the State of Illinois.
- (2) Wagering upon the result of any game, contest or any political nomination, appointment or election.
- (3) Operating, keeping, owning, using, purchasing, exhibiting, renting, selling, bargaining for the sale or lease of, manufacturing or distributing any gambling device.
- (4) Knowingly owning or possessing any book, instrument or apparatus by means of which bets or wagers have been or are recorded or registered or knowingly possessing any money which has been received in the course of a bet or wager.
- (5) Selling pools upon the result of any game or contest of skill or chance, politial nomination, appointment or election.
- (6) Setting up or promoting any lottery or sellin, offering to sell or transferring any ticket or share for any lottery unless specifically provided by the laws of the State of Illinois.
- (7) Setting up or promoting any policy game or selling, offering to sell or knowingly possessing or transferring any policy ticket, slip record, document or other similar device.

A person found guilty of gambling within the Harrisburg Park District shall be fined in an amount not less than \$25.00 but not greater than \$200.00.

CHAPTER 2 PARK RULES REGULATING THE USE OF PARKS AND PARK FACILITIES

Section 2.01 Animals

- (a) No person shall hunt, trap, catch, wound or kill or treat cruelly, or attempt to hunt, trap, catch, wound or kill any bird or animal in any park.
- (b) No person shall bring a dog or cat within the park system controlled by the District unless properly leashed and under control at all times.
- (c) No person shall ride, drive or lead any farm or domestic animal, except dogs, over or through any park or playground in the District or haul, drag or ride any agricultural vehicle therein or any vehicle except on the roads or areas provided for that purpose.
- (d) No person shall lead, ride or allow to be loose upon District property, any horse, pony or other riding animal except in areas designated for riding and by express consent of the Park Board.
- (e) Any animal found within the park system in violation of this section may be apprehended, removed to the animal shelter, public pound or any other place provided for that purpose and impounded, all at the expense of the owner.

Section 2.02 Fires

No person shall light or make use of any fire in the park system except at such places as may be established for such purposes and then only under such purposes and then only under such rules as may be prescribed therefor. Every fire shall be continuously under the care and direction of a competent person from the time it is kindled until it is completely extinguished.

Section 2.03 Sound Amplification

No person within the Harrisburg Park District system shall play or operate any sound amplification device including radios, television sets, phonographs, tape decks, public address systems, amplified musical instruments and the like or operate any other energy amplification device in a manner which may reasonably be expected to annoy other persons in the parks.

Section 2.04 Intoxicating Liquors

No person shall sell or vend any intoxicating liquor upon any property of the Harrisburg Park District unless a special permit is obtained from the Park Board.

Section 2.05 Refuse

No person shall deposit or leave any garbage, tree, shrub or grass trimmings or clippings, refuse or other material of any kind on the park system grounds or waters. Papers, glass, can, garbage and other refuse of every kind resulting from picnics or other proper use of the park system shall be deposited in receptacles provided for that purpose, and no person shall litter, suffer, or cause the park system to be littered in any way.

Section 2.06 Restricted Areas

No person shall enter upon any portion of the park system where persons are prohibited by the District as indicated by sign or notice. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any building or area in the park system when it is closed to the public or scheduled for a specific group oractivity, unless invited by same.

Section 2.07 Trees-Shrubs

- (a) No person shall cut, break, or in any way injure or deface any tree, shrub, plant, flower, turf, or any of the buildings or other structures and properties, or dig into the soil or into any road, park, parkway or playground within the Harrisburg Park District without permission of the Park Board.
- (b) No person shall trespass, stand, walk, ride or write upon any place laid out and appropriated for shrubbery or grass.
- (c) No person shall cut, quarter or remove any dying, dead or downed trees or shrubs from the Harrisburg Park District property without permission of the Maintenance Director.

Section 2.08 Keep to Drives

No person shall drive any automobile, truck, motorcycle, or other motorized vehicle within any of the parks of the District except upon the parking lots and roadways provided for driving or parking the same, except Park District employees in the performance of their duties.

Section 2.09 Speed Restrictions

(a) No vehicle may be driven upon any roadway within the Harrisburg Park District at a speed which is greater than is reasonable and proper with regard to traffic conditions and the use of the highway, or which endangers the safety of any person or property. The fact that the speed of the vehicle does not exceed the applicable maximum speed limit does not relieve the driver from the duty to decrease speed when approaching and crossing an intersection, when approaching and going around a curve, when approaching a hillcrest, when traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway, or when special hazard exists with respect to pedestrians or other traffic or by reason of weather or highway conditions. Speed must be decreased as may be necessary to avoid colliding with any person or vehicle on or entering the roadway in compliance with legal requirements and the duty of all persons to use due care.

- (b) No person may drive a vehicle upon any roadway of the Park District system at a speed which is greater than 10 MPH.
- (c) In every charge of violation of this section by failure to observe an applicable speed limit, the complaint shall specify the speed at which the defendant is alleged to have driven, and the speed limit which is applicable at the place of the alleged violation.
- (d) Violations of this section shall result in a fine no less than \$25.00 and no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.10 Parking, Standing or Stopping Illegally

No person shall park, stand or otherwise stop a vehicle within any Park of the District, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Police Officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (a) On lawn areas and grounds.
- (b) In front of public or private driveways or loading zones.
- (c) In any position to block another car legally parked.
- (d) At any place where official signs prohibiting parking entirely or prohibiting parking for more than a specified period have been posted by the District.
 - (e) In any Park beyond the normal closing hour of 11:00 p.m.
- (f) In any position which obstructs or interferes with the travel of other vehicles on a roadway or the use of any park facility within the District.
- (g) Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant or a traffic control signal or sign.

A vehicle may be legally parked in designated parking areas and unless otherwise prohibited, along all roadways provided that the parked vehicle is parallel with the roadway and no more than five (5) feet distant therefrom, measured from the edge of blacktop if roadway is blacktopped.

Section 2.10 (b) Penalty for Violation - Manner of Payment of Fines

(a) The owner or driver of any vehicle which is parked or permitted to stand in violation of the provisions of 2.11 (a) may avoid prosecution for violating same by paying to the District official as may be designated by the Park District Board, the sums designated below and by surrendering to such designated person, the traffic ticket delivered to him or placed upon such vehicle after indicating thereon his name and address; such designated person shall give the person paying such sum a receipt therefore bearing his signature and the date of

- the payment. The duplicate of the receipt, together with the money paid to such designated person, shall be delivered to the Park District Business Administrator.
- (b) The amounts to be paid such designated person shall be \$25.00 for all violations of Section 2.11 (a). Whenever the above violations are not paid within five (5) days, the sum shall be \$35.00.

Section 2.10(c) Notice to Offender for Paying Violation

Each Park Police Officer shall attach to every vehicle parking in violation of any provisions of 2.10(a), a notice that such vehicle has been so illegally parked and which instructs the operator or owner that he or she, in five (5) days, has the right to a hearing on the violation or that he or she may voluntarily waive the right to a hearing and plead guilty as charged to such violation. Each such person may, within five (5) days of the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay as the penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation the sum provided by Section 2.10(b). The failure of such person to pay such payment within five (5) days shall render such person subject to penalty provided in Section 2.10(b) and 2.10(d).

- Section 2.10(d) Penalty for Failure to Appear and Non-Payment of Parking Fine
- (a) Any person who, after given written notice that he or she is in violation of Section 2.10(a), fails to appear, plead guilty and waive right to a hearing or plead not quilty and request a hearing, will be subject to the issuance of a warrant for his or her arrest.
- (b) Any such person so arrested by a warrant after failing to appear will be allowed to post a bond in the sum equal to each individual parking violation penalty, penalties for late payment, plus any other penalties as provided by this Code.

Section 2.11 Impounding of Vehicles

Any vehicle parked or standing within the park system in violation of any law, ordinance, or rule is hereby declared to be a public nuisance. Such vehicle may be removed and impounded and the owner or person entitled to possession of the vehicle shall pay all charges and expenses arising out of any action taken here under.

Section 2.12 Obstruction Traffic

No person shall park or place any vehicle or other property of any kind within the Park District so as to obstruct or interfere with traffic or travel of other vehicles or pedestrians or endanger the public safety. A person found guilty of violation this provision shall be fined in an amount no less than \$10.00 and no greater than \$100.00.

- Section 2.13 Persons Under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor or Narcotic Drugs
 - (a) No person who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor may

drive or be in actual physical control of any vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District.

- (b) No person who is an habitual user of or under the influence of any narcotic drug or who is under the influence of any other drug to a degree which renders him incapable of safley driving a vehicle may drive or or be in actual physical control of any vehicle within the Harrisburg Park district. The fact that a person charged with a violation of this subsection is or has been entitled to use such drugs under the law of the State of Illinois does not constitute a defense against any charge of violation of this subsection.
- (c) Upon the trial of any action or proceeding arising out of the acts alleged to have been committed by any person while driving or in actual physical control of a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, evidence of the amount of alcohol in the person's blood at the time of the act alleged as shown by a chemical analysis of his breath, blood, urine, saliva, or other bodily substance is admissible, as provided hereinafter in this paragraph and the result of any such analysis shall give rise to the following presuptions:
- (1) If there was at the time of such analysis 0.05 percent or less by weight of alcohol in the person's blood, it shall be presumed that the person was not under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (2) If there was at the time of such analysis in excess of 0.05 percent but less than 0.10 percent by eeight of alcohlo in the person's blood, such fact shall not give rise to any presumption that the person wad or was not under the influence of intoxicating liquor, but such fact may be considered with other competent evidence in determining whether such person was under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (3) If there was at the time of such analysis 0.10 percent or more by weight of alcohol in the person's blood, it shall be presumed that the person was under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

Percent by weight of alcohol in the blood shall be based upon grams of alcohol per 100 cubic centimeters of blood. Evidence based upon a chemical analysis of blood, urine, breath or other bodily substance shall not be admitted unless such substance was procured and such analysis made with the consent of the person as provided by the implied consent law of the State of Illinois as set out in Section 11-105.1 of Chapter 95-2 of Illinois Revised Statutes.

The foregoing provisions of this paragraph shall not be constructed as limiting the introduction of any other competent evidence bearing upon the question whether or not the defendant was under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

(d) Chemical analysis of the person's blood or breath to be considered valid under this Section must be performed according to uniform standards adopted be the State Department of Public Health in cooperation with the Superintendent of State Police, and be an individual possessing a valid permit issued by that Department for this purpose. The State Department of Public Health is authouized to approve satisfactory techniques or methods to ascertain the qualifications and competence of individuals to conduct such analysis and to issue pemits which shall be subject to termination or revecation at the discretion of the State Department of Public Health.

- (e) when an unconscious person or person otherwise incapable of refusal is given a blood test at the request of a law enforcement office under the provisions of this Chapter, only a physician authorized to practice medicine in all its branches, a registered nurse or other qualified person may withdraw blood, in a manner prescribed by the Department of Public Health for the purpose of determining the alcoholic content therein.
- (f) The person tested may have a physician authorized to practice medicine in all its branches, a qualified technician, chemist, registered nurse, or other qualified person of his own choosing to administer a chemical test or tests, at hisown expense, in addition to any administered at the direction of a law enforcement officer. The failure or inability to obtain an additional test by a person does not preclude the admission of evidence relating to the test or tests taken at the direction of a law enforcement officer.
- (g) Upon the request of the person who submitted to a chemical test or tests at the request of a law enforcement officer, full information concerning the test or tests must be made available to him, or his attorney.
- (h) Every person who is convicted of a violation of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 and no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.14 Reckless Driving

Any person who drives and vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District with a willful or wanton disregard for the safety or persons or property is quilty of redkless driving. A person who is found quilty of reckless driving shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.15 Fleeing or Attempting to Elude Police Officer

No person who is a driver or operator of a motor vehicle within the HarrisburgPark District who, having been given a visual or audible signal by a police officer directing such driver or operator to bring this vehicle to a stop, may willfully fail or refuse to obey such direction, increase his speed, extinguish his lights or otherwise flee or attempt of elude the officer. The signal given by th police officer may be by hand, voice, siren or red light, provided the officer giving such signal shall be in marked showing it to be an official police which. A person found guilty of fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 fut no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.16 Drag Racing

No person who is an operator of a motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District may be a participant in the act of drag racing. A person found guilty of drag racing shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

"Drag Racing" means the act of two or more individuals competing or racing in the Harrisburg Park District in a situation in which one of the motor vehicles is beside or to the rear of a motor vehicle operated by a competing driver and

the one driver attempts to pre vent the competing driver from passing or overtaking him, either by acceleration or maneuver, or one or more individuals competing in a race against time on any street or roadway within the Harrisburg Park District.

Section 2.17 No Valid Registration

Every motor vehicle operated over the streets and readways of the Harrisburg Park District which is subject to registration under the laws of the State of Illinois shall have attached there to license plates or a valid temporary permit issued by the Illinois Secretary of State evidencing payment to the State of proper license fees provided for in the motor vehicle laws of the State of Illinois. A person found guilty of operating a motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District without proper license plates or a valid temporary permit attached thereto shall be fined in an amount no less than \$2.00 but no greater than \$7500.

Section 2.18 No Valid Driver's License - Driving after Suspension or Revocation

No person shall operate or drive a motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District who is not licensed to do so under the laws of the State of Illinois. A person who is not licensed to persons who have never been issued a valid driver's license or permit or whose driver's license or permit has been suspended or revoked by the Secretary of State of Illinois and who operate or drive a motor vehicle during the period of that suspension or revocation before their privilege to drive has been reinstated by the Secretary of State. A person found guilty of operating or mit shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.19 No Driver's License on Person - Failure to Display

Every person shall have his driver's license or permit in his immediate possession at all times when operating a motor vehicle in the Harrisburg Park District and for the purpose of indicating compliance with this requirement, shall display such license or pemit if it is in his possession upon demand made when in uniform or displaying a badge or other sign of authority by a member of the Park District Police Force, or any other duly authorized peace officer. However, no person charged with violating this section shall be convicted if he produces in court satisfactory evidence that a driver's license was thertofore issued to him and was valid at the time of his arrest. A person who is convicted of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$25.00.

For the purpose of this section "Display" means the manual Surrender of His license certificate or permit into the hands of the demanding officer for his inspection thereof.

Section 2.20 Authority for Traffic Signals

- (a) The Harrisburg Park District through its designated officers with reference to the streets and roadways within the District may designate through streets and roadways and direct stop signs or yield signs at specified entrances thereto or may designate any intersection as a stop intersection as a stop intersection or as a yield intersection and direct stop signs or yield signs at one or more entrances to such intersections.
- (b) Every stop sign and yield sign shall be located as near as practicable to the nearest line of the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or, if there is no crosswalk, then as colose as practicable to the nearest line of

intersection roadway.

(c) The District shall place and maintain such traffic control devices and signs as it mey deem necessary on all roadways and streets under its jurisdiction in order to indicate and carry out the provisions of this chapter or otherwise regulate, warn or guide traffic.

Section 2.21 Obedience to Traffic Control Devices

- (a) Every person operating a motor vehicle in the Park District shall obey the instructions of any traffic control device applicable thereto placed in accordance with this chapter, unless otherwise directed by a Police Officer subject to the excetptions granted the drivet of an authorized emergency vehicle defined in the traffic laws of the State of Illinois.
- (b) It is unlawful for any person to leave a roadway and travel across private property or Park District property to avoid an official traffic control device.
- (c) No provisions of this chapter for which official traffic control devices are required shall be in force against an alleged violator if at the time and place of the alleged violation an official device is not in proper position and sufficiently ligible to be seen by an ordinarily observant person.
- (d) Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.22 Obedience to Stop and Yield Signs

- (a) Preferential right of way at an intersection within the Harrisburg Park District may be indicated by stop signs or yield signs as authorized in Section 2.20 of this chapter.
- (b) Except when directed to proceed by a Police Officer or traffic control signal, every driver of a motor vehicle approaching a stop intersection indicated be a stop sign shall stop before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or in the event there is no crosswalk, shall stop at a clearly marked stop line but if none, then at the point nearest the intersection roadway where the driver has a view of the approaching traffic on the intersection roadway before entering the intersection.
- (c) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign if required for safety to stop, shall stop before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or in the event there is no crosswalk, the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic upon the intersecting roadway.

(d) A person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.23 Driving on Right Side of Roadway

A person driving or operating a motor wehicle within the Harrisburg Park District upon any roadway or streets of sufficient width shall drive his vehicle upon the right half of the roadway except as follows:

- (1) When an obstruction exists making it neccessary to drive to the left of the center of the roadway; provided any person so doing shall yield the right of the way to all vehicles traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed portion of the roadway within such distance as to constitute an immediate hazard, or
 - (2) Upon a roadway restricted to one-way traffic.

A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25 00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.24 One-Way Roadways and Rotary Traffic Islands

- (a) The Harrisburg Park District through its designated officers with respect to the roadways and streets under its control may designate any roadway or street upon which vehicular traffic shall proceed in one direction at all or such times as shall be indicated by official traffic control devices.
- (b) Upon a roadway so designated for one-way traffic a vehicle shall be driven only in the direction designated at all or such times as shall be indicated by official traffic control devices.
- (c) A vehicle passing around a rotary traffic island must be driven only to the right of such island.

A person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$2500 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.25 Starting a Parked Vehicle

No person within ght Harrisburg Park District shall start movement of a vehicle which is stopped, standing or parked unless and until such movement can be made with reasonable safety. A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.26 Opening Vehicle Doors

No person within the Harrisburg Park District shall open the door of a

a vehicle on the side available to moving traffic unless and until it is reasonably safe to do so and can be done without interfering with the movement of other traffic, nor shall any person leave a door open on the side of a vehicle available to moving traffic for a perios of time longer than necessary to load or unload passingers. A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.27 Coasting Prohibited

The driver of any motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District which is traveling upon a downgrade shall not coast with the gears or transmission of such vehicle in neutral. A person found grilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than 25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.28 Driving upon Sidewalk

No person shall drive any motor driven vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District upon a sidewalk or sidewalk area except upon a permanent or duly arthorized temporary driveway or for routine maintenance, utility or emergency service or for special delivery or pickup involving goods or customer services. A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined an amount no less than \$2500 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.29 Illegal Transportation of Alcoholic Liquor

No person within the Harrisburg Park District shall transport, carry, possess or have any alcoholic liquor in the passenger area of any motor vehicle except in the original package and with the seal unbroken. A person convicted of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.30 Negligent Driving

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle in a neglignet manner within the Harrisburg Park District. For the prupose of this section, to "operate in a negligent manner" means the operation of a vehicle in such a manner as to endanger or be likely to endanger the safety of any persons or property. A person convicted of this offense shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00

Section 2.31 Unlawful use of License or Permit

It is unlawful within the Harrisburg Park District for any person:

1. To display or cause or permit to be displayed or have in his possession any cancelled, revoked, suspended, fictitions, or fraudulently altered license or permit;

- 2. To lend his license or permit to any other person or knowingly allow the use thereof by another;
- 3. To display or represent as his own any license or permit not issued to him;
 - 4. To permit any unlawful use of a license or permit issued to him.
- (b) No person shall operate a motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District in a manner which will cause loud and unnecessary squealing of that vehicle's tires upon acceleration from a stopped position or upon that vehicle negotiating any turn, stop or like maneuver.

A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$2500 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.32 Suspension System

It shall be unlawfull to operate a motor vehicle within the Harresburg Park District when the suspension system has been modified from the original manufactured design by lifting the bidy from the chassis in excess of 3" or to cause the horizontal line from the front to the rear bumper to vary over 3" in height when measured from a level surface of the highway to the lower edge of the bumper.

A person found violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.33 Lights and Lamps

- (a) All motor vehicles driven within the Harrisburg District during the period from sunset to sunrise or at any other time when visivility is so limited as to require the use of lights for safety, shall exhibit two such lighted driving lamps showing white lights or light of a yellow or amber tint visible for at least 500 feet in the direction the motor vehicle is proceeding, except a motorcycle with only one such lamp.
- (b) Every motor vehicle driven within the Harrisburg Park District shall' also exhibit at least two lighted lamps commonly known as tail lamps which shall be mounted on the left rear and right rear of the vehicle so as to throw a red light visible for at least 500 feet in the reverse direction, except that a motorcycle need be equipped with only one such lamp.
- (c) Either a tail lamp or a separate lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to illuminate with a white light a rear registration plate when required and render it clearly legible from a distance of 50 feet to the rear.

Any person founk guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 and no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.34 Brakes

Every motor vehicle operated within the Harrisburg Park District shall be equipped with brakes adequate to control the movement of and to stop and hold such vehicle, and all such brakes shall be maintained in good working order and shall be so adjusted as to operate as evenly as practicable with respect to the wheels on opposite sides of the vehicle.

A person convicted of any of the above provisions shall be fined in an amount no less than \$50.00 and no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.35 Right-Way-Rules

The following right-of-way-rules shall applu to any person driving a vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District.

- (a) When two vehicles approach or enter an intersection, not otherwise contrilled by a traffic signal, from different roadways at approximately the same time, the driver of the vehicle on the left must yield the right of way to the vehicle on the right.
- (b) The driver of a vehicle intending to turn to the left within an intersection or into an alley, private road or driveway shall yield the right of way to any vehicle approaching from the opposite direction which is so close as to constitute an immediate hazard but said driver having so yielded may proceed at such time as a safe interval occurs.
- (c) Except when directed to proceed by a Police Officer or traffic control signal, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection indicated by a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or if none, then at the point mearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right of way to any vehicle which has entered the intersection from another roadway or which is approaching so closely on the roadway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when the driver is moving actoss or within, the intersection, but said driver having so yielded may proceed at such time as a safe interval occurs.
- (d) The driver of a vehicle approaching a yield sign shall in obedience to such sign slow down to a speed reasonable for the existing conditions and, if required for safety to stop, shallstop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or if none, then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway. After slowing or stopping, the driver shall yield the right of way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on another roadway so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time such driver is moving across or within the intersection.

A person found guilty of violating any of the above paragraphs of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.36 Prevention of Unnecessary Noise

(a) Every notor vehicle driven or operated within the Harrisburg Park District shall at all times be equipped with an adequate muffler or exhaust system in constant operation and properly maintained to prevent any excessive or unusual noise.

A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.37 Unattended Motor Vehicles

No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle within the Harrisburg Park District shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine and removing the ignition key, and when standing upon any perceptible grade without effectively setting the brake and turning the front vehicle wheels to the curb or side of the road.

A person found tyilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.38 Limitations on Backing

The driver of a vehicle within the Harrisburg Pard District shall not back the same unless such movement can be made with safety and without interfering with other traffic.

A person found guilty of violating this section snall be fined in an amount no less than \$25.00 but no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.39 Traffic Laws Applied to Persons Riding Bicycles or Animals or Driving Animal Drawn Venicles

Every person riding a bicycle or an animal or duiving any animal drawing a vehicle upon a roadway or street within the Harrisburg Park Distric shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter of the Harrisburg Park Distric Code applicable to the driver of a vehicle except those provisions of Chapter 10 which be their nature can have no application.

Action 2.40 Bioycles ---- Necessary Equipment

Every person operating a bicycle within the Harrisburg District will keep said bicycle in safe mechanical condition and equipped as follows;

- (a) On the front shall be installed a lamp which emits a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front and also shall be installed a clear reflex reflector or reflective material at least 3/16" wide visible to the front and said lamp installed in front shall be used during the period from sunset to sunrise or at any other time when visibility is so limited as to require the use of the light for safety. No lampshall be required if such bicycle is intended to be and is in fact used only during daylight hours when a lamp is clearly unnecessary.
- (b) On the rear shall be installed a red reflex reflector or red reflective material at least 3/16" wide visible to the rear. A lamp emitting a red light visible to the rear may also be used.
- (c) Every bicycle shall be equipped with a brake or brakes which eill enable the operator to make the braked wheels skid on dry, level, clean pavement.

Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less that \$2500 and no greater than \$100.00.

Section 2.41 Use of District Roadways

- (a) The use of roadways situated within the Rockford Pard District is Limited to the operators of motor vehicles licensed under the law of the State of Illinois.
- (b) The use of Park District roadways is further limited to those persons sho operate non-motorized vehicles which includes but is not specifically limited to bicycles, or those cycles which bear three wheels and are specially constructed for use by the handicapped.
- (c) The use of Park District roadways is specifically forbidden to those persons operating non-motorized objects or vehicles referred to as skateboards, pushwagons, unicycles, tricycles, minibikes or any other non-motorized object or vehicle which is not specifically allowed by Paragraphs (a) and (b) of this section.

Persons found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$200.00.

Section 2.42 Permitting Unauthorized Person to Drive

No person shall cause, authorize or knowingly permit a motor vehicle owned by him or under his control, to be driven within the workford Park District by any person who is not authorized or licensed by the laws of the State Of Illinois.

A person found guilty of violating this section shall be fined in an amount no less than \$25 00 and no greater than \$200.00.

Section 2.43 Use of Park Facilities or Premisis for Swimming or Diving Prohibited

No person shall use any facilities or premises in the Park System for seimming or diving. This provision shall not apply to the swimming pool facilities.

CHAPTER 3 ENFORCEMENT

Section 3.01 Permits

(a) Any act prohibited by or under this code or any other ordinance or rule of the District, provided such act be not otherwise prohibited by law or ordinance, shall be lawfrl to the extent authorized or permitted under the provisions of a permit issued or permission granted by the District.

(b) Permits shall be issued and permission granted only upon the payment of such fees as may be established from time to time by the District. All terms for the issuance of the permits and granting of permission must be strictly complied with, and any violation of same or any other law, ordinance, or rule of the District shall be grounds for revocation of same.

Section 3.02 Rules to be Obeyed

No person shall violate or disobey any rule of the District relating to the use and government of the park system. The Derector of the District or his authorized representatives may issue such rules and regulations as are necessary to insure public health and safety in the use and enfoyment of any and all park facilities, including but not limited to its swimming pools, golf courses and any other recreational facilities.

Section 3.03 Penalties

Any person violating or disobeying any clauses or provision of any section of Chapters I and II of this ordinance or any of the other regulatory ordinances or rules of the District shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, may be forthwith ejected from the park system, may have any permits or passes previously issued forfeited for the season and shall be fined upon conviction not less than one dollar () and not more than two humdred dollars (\$200.00) for each offense, the fine to be recovered in manner and form as provided by law. A separate offense shall be deemed committed upon each day during or on which violation occure or continues.
