2021 Retreat Update

I just got word from Zephyr Point Conference Center that we received our requested dates of May 17-20, 2022 for our next retreat and a new contract will be forth coming. Some things have changed and some have remained the same; the same will be Tallac for housing and Echo Peak as our conference room. The change is a small food cost increase and a more significant increase in the cost of the rooms. The rooms have increased from \$110 a night to \$130, with no difference in the charge for the number of the people in the rooms. This means we will see an increase in our base cost next year, which will be \$310 ($$65 \times 3 = 190) per person for three nights and 8 meals (\$112.50 increased to \$115.00.)

However: its still a bargain, especially considering the setting.

During Margaret Mathewson's willow classes, participants commented on how much they liked her teaching methods and were enjoying working with willow, a suggestion was made that she come back to the retreat to teach. We have extended an invitation to Margaret, to return to our annual retreat in 2022 as our guest instructor. She is working on some ideas for weaving projects with willow, bark and other natural materials. Details will be forth coming this Fall.

We are also looking for ideas for other projects at the retreat, maybe some older ones or new ones. If you would like to teach or request a particular project please contact me. I especially liked the twined rattle dolls and the willow goddess figures. Wire or waxed linen might be a fun project—so put on your thinking caps.

August 5, 2021 Meeting Program - Tule Wall Bag

Bring: Soaked tule - 12 spokes, about 20" long, 1/2" wide 20 weavers, at least 30" long, 1/4-3/8" wide

Scissors, towel, spray bottle

If you gathered tule last week and let it dry it should be okay to use. Soak dry tule the night before and when pliable wrap in a damp towel. Do not keep damp more than 1 day at a time, allow to air at night if you don't finish your project

November 3, 2021 #1 Apple in the Pine (Material fee—\$85)

Level: Intermediate / Advanced (8 hours)

The base begins with a vintage spigot handle, threaded with Cedar bark. Twine the base with waxed cotton cord and iris leaves to upright. Using thinner Cedar and wider Willow bark learn the fun and challenging Japanese knot weave. A basic braid track border completes the piece. (4" x 4")





November 4, 2021 #2 Fluted Constellation (Material fee—\$75) Level: Intermediate / Advanced (8 hours)

Beginning with a unique threaded base of Willow and Cedar barks; weave this sweet and functional basket with an interesting twist. The fluted sides and rim are resultant of a weave change to the basket. The braided Cedar rim enhances the overall flow. $(6^{\circ} \times 6^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ})$

November 5, 2021 #3 Double Helix (Material fee—\$85)

Level: Intermediate (8 hours)

Students will heat fold and stitch a hexagonal Birch bowl with split Spruce roots. Next a spiraling liner of hexagonal to bias woven Willow or Cedar bark (or a combination) will be added. The braided rim of Cedar bark was taught to me by Dawn Walden. (6" x 3")





November 6, 2021 #4 Barks on the Bias (Material fee-\$100) Level: Intermediate (6 hours)

Students will learn to weave this non-traditional basket with thin Birch bark. Overlays of Poplar and Hemlock barks will be added for color and textural notes. The faux braided rim was taught to me by master basketmaker Dawn Walden and is executed with Cedar bark. A hanger handle is sewn and installed with fine brass washers to secure the stitching. (7" x 6" x 5")



Willow for our classes traveled nearly 500 miles.

Karen Olson picked it up at Margaret Mathewson's farm in Alsea, Oregon. Then it was stored, sorted and soaked in Karen's canoe and a huge tub that she and her family built.

Then they hosted the class in their lovely backyard where we all enjoyed the cats, alpacas, chickens, and the fabulous thunderstorm.

June 3, 2021 GBB General Meeting Minutes submitted by Sandy Zoerner. Meeting held at Masonic Center in Sparks. Meeting called to order by president Betty Hulse at 11:00 am. 16 members present plus 4 attending via ZOOM. No meeting in July, next in-person meeting planned for August.

<u>Treasurer's report by Karen O:</u> Currently there is \$14,170.39 in checking and savings. This includes income received toward special classes. Website and building rental has been paid for the year. The true balance in our accounts is approximately \$8000 once the fees are paid out for the special classes.

Business & Activity Reports: The board revised the policy on special workshops. They are to be self-supporting with the costs to be equally divided amongst the participants and there will be no refunds once the contract has been secured with the instructor.

There currently is a need for a raffle person to secure items for the raffle, select items for raffle, and sell tickets.

There is a need for instructors for August and September classes. If interested, see Ann. There are a few spaces available for Margaret's workshops in June/July and Karen's workshops in November.

There will be a tule gathering July 15 in Sierra Valley coordinated by Trisha. Possible tule class in August or September. There is a craft sale at Molly's Saturday 9-3.

Materials donated from Eileen Brilliant's family have been sorted and priced. Look for those treasures you have been needing. Some items are being saved to raffle during our retreat next year.

<u>Library Report by Pam Wilcox</u>: There are still several outstanding books which need to be returned. When you bring your book back, please put the card back into the pocket inside the book. Thank you. There are some tools and molds available also.

Opportunities for Basket makers: We can provide demonstrations and distribute brochures during Reno Food Systems Sunday market from 10-2. Making lavender wands was one of the suggestions. More opportunity for demonstrations is during the Art Festival in September in Carson City.

A wonderful show and tell was presented by our talented members followed by lunch and visits with old friends.
