

## Feedback on City Council Goals and Priorities

### Historic and Cultural Preservation Committee

June 2021

At their June meeting the Historic and Cultural Preservation Committee reaffirmed their commitment to the goals submitted prior to the 2019 community goal setting. Recognizing that the City has been hit with unprecedented challenges over the past two years, the HCPC voiced their commitment to the original input provided and a desire to see the City designate staff resources to move these priorities forward.

#### HISTORIC AND CULTURAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

- Trestle rehabilitation, including assignment as a city project with city staff liaison assigned and understanding that the overall project may be longer term than the next two-year goal setting period.
- Incorporate ways for Historic and Cultural Preservation Committee to do preliminary review/concept review to provide early feedback to applicants.
- Consider a 1% fee for historic preservation like public art to increase funding opportunities to facilitate the city's preservation efforts
- Explore potential historic district designation of Riverfront Warehouse District as originally referenced in the Central Petaluma Specific Plan
- Complete Certified Local Government designation process
- Increase enforcement efforts in historic districts, including educational opportunities
- Designate Historic Railroad Tracks through central Petaluma a local landmark to ensure protection and preservation.
