

APRIL ZOOM MEETING

As many of you know, Ed is the inventor of the DBJ-1 and DBJ-2 antenna that was featured in the February 2003 and March 2007 QST. His latest article in QST was the TBJ-1 - a triband base antenna published in March 2017. The DBJ-2 won the Plaque of the Month Award. There are over 30,000 of these antennas in use today. About half are used by hams and the other half by government and commercial entities. In this month's presentation, Ed will first review how the original DBJ-1 works and then how he managed to convert the original DBJ-1 into a portable antenna. The BARS Board of Directors met March 15th in the basement of Arlington Christian Church. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by club president Brad James, WA4HBM.

Board members present were:

Second Vice-President David Richardson (DR) W9KHZ
Treasurer Bart Breeding (BB) KB4FEE
Secretary Chris Gay (CG) KU4A
Director-at-large Tim Kunkel (TK) KF4MPM

This constituted a quorum of six board members.

Others present were: Harvey Frye AA4HF Barry Jackson WB4N

CG moved, seconded by TK, that the meeting be adjourned no later than 9:00 PM. Motion approved by board.

TREASURER'S REPORT

BB read the treasurer's report. DR moved, seconded by CG, that the report be approved as read. Motion passed. BB presented six new membership applications. DR moved, seconded by TK, that the applications be approved. Motion passed.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

CG reported that he obtained a rubber stamp with the club's new address. For any board members who need to send mail, he can make available envelopes with the return address pre-stamped.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Audit Committee, CG chair

CG reported that the audit of 2020 financials was complete. He will send to newsletter editor BB a copy of the report so that interested members can request it via e-mail.

Executive Committee, RBJ chair No report.

Finance Committee, BB chair

BB reported that he was working on updating the roster. When a member pays dues, he is sending a receipt via e-mail rather than paper. He was asked to update the board on the status of the transition from the outgoing treasurer to him as new treasurer. He replied that some of the keys to the new post office box are missing. There also does not seem to be a supply of blank membership cards. DR indicated that he can make new cards in short order and will do so. Otherwise the transition has been fairly smooth. BB is able to log on to online access of all accounts.

HIGH PRIORITY OLD BUSINESS

On the subject of the new club patch, RBJ reported that he distributed patches in the Red Cross parking lot Saturday morning. A number of free patches were dispersed, and he sold \$94 worth of additional patches. He plans to return to the parking lot next Saturday.

DR reported that the replacement of the lock on the outside door of the shack has been completed at a cost of around \$175. This was necessary due to the fact that there were problems with key duplication for the old lock, and many keys were out and unaccounted for.

On the topic of "shack refurb", DR reported that an individual is going to give him a quote on floor cleaning in the club shack area. It was decided that we can proceed on painting the walls and new ceiling tiles. CG moved, seconded by DR, that the board authorize an expenditure of up to \$200 to be spent on paint, painting supplies and new ceiling tiles. Motion passed. More "shopping" will be done to locate new vanities and better quality light bulbs.

BB reported that he is now able to make a monthly distribution of the club roster to board members, as requested by the board.

DR reported that the new rotator that was ordered in November is still on backorder. The supply chain is completely backed up. Ham Radio Outlet says it will be at least 2-3 months before the rotator will be available. The work that needs to be done on the ground for the club antenna farm can proceed as we head into nicer weather.

RBJ reported on recent changes to the club bank accounts. Central Bank has been directed to not accept club checks unless they have two signatures. For security reasons, a new savings account has been opened which requires two club officers (President and Treasurer) to be physically present for a withdrawal. This is in addition to the existing savings account which the treasurer can access.

DR reported on the club's Winter Field Day participation. The event was a success, but he is becoming increasingly frustrated about the proliferation of high-powered home stations in ARRL Field Day and Winter Field Day. Unless the contest sponsors (ARRL for Field Day and The Winter Field Day Association for Winter Field Day) make changes to the rules, he may well cease volunteering to organize the club's participation in these events.

DR moved, seconded by RB, that the board approve the new Hamfest site, which will be the new Jackpot Bingo location on Woodhill Drive. Motion passed. This site will allow for both indoor and outdoor tables.

HIGH PRIORITY NEW BUSINESS

The board discussed whether or not to hold a special election to fill the position of treasurer recently vacated. It was decided to let BB hold the position of treasurer until the next regular election. BB resigned as director-at-large. DR reported that he had talked to several possible candidates to replace BB as director-at-large. RBJ moved, seconded by DR, that Jewell Vest, KO4EPJ be appointed as director-at-large. Motion passed.

DR and BB reported that they are making plans for a Technician license to be conducted on Zoom in the near future.

RBJ, as chair of the outreach committee, asked the members of the board to consider the possibility of organizing a project to telephone all BARS members to inquire about their interests in the hobby and how the club might better serve them. He asked board members to consider the types of information what we would like to obtain from such a canvassing project. The board took no further action.

DR reported that he and other club members have been working on building antennas with parts supplied by the club. CG moved, seconded by TK, that the board approve an expenditure of up to \$100 for additional antenna connectors for this project. Motion passed.

The Legend of SuitSat-1 Returns

hen you think of amateur radio satellites, chances are you imagine spacecraft encrusted with antennas and solar panels — polished boxes stuffed with electronics, including receivers and transmitters. But as SpaceX reminded us in 2018 when the company placed a Tesla Roadster sportscar into solar orbit, anything can become a spacecraft!

On February 3, 2006, the crew of the International Space Station installed a 2-meter FM amateur radio transmitter in the helmet of a retired Russian Orlan spacesuit and christened it SuitSat-1. Cosmonaut Valeri Tokarev and astronaut Bill McArthur took SuitSat-1 outside the station during a spacewalk and released it into orbit.

Within 15 minutes, SuitSat-1 began transmitting telemetry and voice messages. According to NASA, the transmissions ended after only two orbits, but others reported hearing the signals, although they were very weak.

The last confirmed signal report from SuitSat-1 was on February 18, 2006. On September 7 that same year, SuitSat-1 re-entered Earth's atmosphere some 1400 km south-southwest of Cape Leeuwin, Western Australia.

And so, this ends the story of SuitSat-1 - or maybe not!

SuitSat-1 was "resurrected" in January 2021 for a key role in a short movie thriller titled Decommissioned.

In the 6=minute film by Perception Pictures, SuitSat-1 returns to haunt International Space Station commander "Diaz," played by Joey Vieira. Diaz is seen taking photos from inside an observations dome on the station when he spies some distant space debris and radios Houston to express concern.

As the object closes in, an increasingly anxious Diaz recognizes the debris as SuitSat-1. "We're picking up transmissions on the ham radio that sound identical to the SuitSat experiment," he tells a skeptical mission control.

"SuitSat re-entered the atmosphere and burned up years ago," mission control responds. "It's impossible." What happens next? Find out by watching the film online at vimeo.com/502018179.



If you're a Technician licensee the start of Cycle 25 with the potential for improved propagation on the high-frequency (HF) bands, may be making you itch for a license upgrade. A whole new world opens to you once you've earned your General- or Extra class license, which gives you operating privileges on the

HF bands, where you can communicate worldwide without the use of repeaters or other infrastructure. Once you've got a license with HF privileges, you'll need an HF radio. Purchasing an HF transceiver is a significant investment. Here are some considerations for this important purchase.

An HF transceiver is the center piece of your radio shack. When you are just getting started, it's easy to say, "I don't need all that," especially when you don't understand what "all that" does. Some

of the features on the better transceivers may seem daunting, but after some time on the air you will begin to see how they can great ly enhance your ham radio operating. Your ham radio interest s and activities are likely to change as you gain experience, so don't be afraid to buy more radio th an you need right now - you can grow into a full-featured transceiver.

Functions and Features

A transceiver that produces 100 watts RF output and can operate on 160 meters through 10 meters is a good place to start. Many of the current production models will operate on the 6-meter band too. The primary operating modes on HF are AM/SSB, CW, and digital.

Digital functions can be a little confusing. You may see transceivers with mode selections labelled "RTTY" or "FSK." This is a reference to radioteletype and frequency-shift keying, respectively. Other transceivers simply offer "digit al," which can be almost any digital mode, such as FT8.

If digital operating piques your interest, you'll be glad to know that any SSB transceiver can be used in this fashion. It doesn't need to have specific digital modes built in. That said, by spending more for a radio with digital operating included among the features you'll find that it is easier to get on the air with these modes. For example, with an

ordinary SSB transceiver you will need an external device that your computer will use to swap information with the radio. More expensive transceivers already include this device and require only a USB cable to connect to your computer.

Other features like automatic antenna tuners, dual VFOs, and electronic CW keyers were once considered luxuries, but are standard on most HF transceivers available to hams today.

Many hams enjoy t he challenge of operating QRP, or low power - using power levels of S watt s output or less. However, it may not be a good idea to limit yourself by buying a low-power radio. It is much easier to reduce t he power of your 100-watt rig if you want to give QRP operating a t ry.

Power Supply

Most of the HF transceivers available today will require an external power source capable of supplying 13.8 volts of de power. For a 100-wat t transceiver, the power supply should be able to supply 25 amps of continuous cur rent, but it is best to check the requirement s for t he radio you will be using. Manufacturers publish their product specifications on their websites so you can determine which power supply will meet your needs, and you can purchase it the same time you buy your radio. BARS E-BAY SALES AND AUCTION SALES OF SURPLUSSED EQUIPMENT

The BARS Board of Directors has adopted a method for the disposal of all items in our donated equipment inventory through the transfer of ownership by making them available for purchase by open public auctions and sales. We have determined that it is to the optimum benefit of BARS that we try to obtain the maximum amount for each item, or related sets of items, by accepting only the highest value received through as fair, and as equitable, and as impartial a public process as reasonably possible. In this way we endeavor to eliminate any impressions of advantage or disadvantage to anyone or group wishing to obtain by purchase any item or items.

Our process in operation now is to periodically, and more-or-less continuously, move a somewhat small and easily manageable group of equipments, selected to some extent at random, from a storage facility to the BARS room at the Red Cross Building. At the BARS room, the equipment is basically evaluated (maybe even "smoke" tested) to determine a reasonably accurate and reliable description of its condition. Any equipments that we envision may be of utility to the Club are retained for use in the shack or the shop. Those items that are marked for sale through E-Bay are weighed and photographed, and then researched in an effort to determine their histories and current comparative values. After that, the equipment's descriptive file, including our asked and reserve price, is up-loaded to the E-Bay sales website under our "Bluegrassars" account to make our intentions universally known that the equipment is publically available by timed auction or instant fixed-price purchase. In this way we are trying to keep up a simple uninterrupted cycle of listings, purchases, and shipments which will eventually deplete our inventory of donated and surplus items and eliminate our need and the expense for a rented storage facility.

The current (and previous) BARS Bylaws in its Preamble is specific in its intention that "*No part of the resources, and/or property, and /or net earnings of the corporation, if any, shall inure to the individual benefit of, or be distributed to, any of its members, trustees, directors, officers, or other private persons…"*. In order to insure our own compliance with our own rules, no offers for purchase of any Club owned items will be considered that are not conducted in an open public venue or setting by the methods currently adopted by BARS. This prevents any perception of preference to any purchaser, including Club members, and provides an element of assurance that the Club realizes a monetary amount that was determined by as fair a market demand value attainable at the time of the sale. We generally consider this approach is of the overall advantage to BARS, its members, as well as any others involved in these types of financial transactions with the Club. In addition, the Club has established a reputation through E-Bay of reliable and highly-rated service which has allowed us to increase our listings due to our so-far proven credibility. The Club intends to maintain this commendable level of association with E-Bay as our outlet for sales of our major surplus'd electronics equipment.

There is a prior knowledge of the items that will be coming to sale by some of the Club members who assist and help with the moving from the storage unit to the BARS room. During the interim period between transporting, preparation, and posting for sale on E-Bay, the items are normally "on display" in the BARS room except for those of exceptional condition and value that are securely stored away to prevent damage or theft. Also, once an item is posted on E-Bay and before its final sale, it is available by appointment for a hands-on, non-destructive, inspection by anyone interested in attaining the item only through the E-Bay venue. The E-Bay sale amount transaction includes the final accepted item price, plus applicable sales tax and estimated shipping costs based on weight and method, that will all be paid by the buyer. The Club receives a net amount after E-Bay listing fees and financial transaction fees are deducted. The difference between the E-Bay assessed and the Club's actual shipping costs are subsequently reconciled by BARS. A local or nearby buyer can forego the E-Bay determined shipping costs by opting for a local in-person pick-up arrangement scheduled at the BARS room with proper purchase confirmation paperwork.

Minor items and equipments that have been judged and determined to be of relatively low nominal value and demand and that probably will not be successfully sold on E-Bay, have been set aside for simpler disposal but still by fair public sales methods. Various assortments of the Club's recently attained donated and then surplus'd items have been sold at the silent auctions conducted at our Hamfests in 2019 and 2018, where the Club deducted the applicable sales tax from the winning bid price rather than add the sales tax on to the buyers cost. A pleasant situation occurred recently when one, if not two, hamfest attendees offered a one-price, take-it-or-leave-it-right-now, amount for some equipment before the close of the silent auction. We could not in good conscience change the rules in fairness to those who had and would be actively bidding on the same item(s). The prospective purchaser was encouraged to place his bid on the auction sheet (with a contact number) as others had, and then see how the offers proceeded. At the end of the auction, the winning bid was from the "one-price" buyer whose unbeaten offer was less than the on-the-spot price he originally proposed. Should BARS have held him to his first bargain? The Club retained its honor and reputation, and our patron retained the difference in his wallet.

The decision of the Board of Directors to respectfully not accept offers for privately arranged purchases of BARS property reflects our position to consider the best interests of BARS and its members and other stakeholders who rely on the Club as an organization to operate with the knowledge of all concerned constituents in an open and visible, even if less than an expedient and seemingly unaccommodating, unbiased and objective manner.

Read the Reviews

QST magazine's monthly Product Reviews are an excellent resource fo r comparing transceivers. The reviews often have a color-coded table, called the Key Measurements Summary, that gives an at-a-glance summary of a radio's performance under testing at ARRL's Lab. In the Lab, transceivers undergo testing t hat conforms to industry standards, and are then sent to experienced hams to be tested in the field. The Product Reviews in QST report on the radio's performance under these real-life conditions, as well as present the result s from the Lab test s. The result is an unbiased review t hat allows you to make an informed decision when purchasing radio equipment . ARRL members can search and read QST Product Reviews at arrl.or g/ reviews-listed-by-manufacturer.

Evaluae your goals and desires for HF operation and look at your budget. Begin wit h a newer mode l transceiver from one of the popular brands offering transceivers capable of at least 100 watt s out put. Purchase t he best that you can afford, because you're sure to expand your
