I THESSALONIANS Part One

I Thessalonians 3:8

For now we live, if ye stand fast in the Lord.

SUMMARY OF THE BOOK

- 1. The <u>background</u> of the church in Thessalonica is found in Acts 17:1-10.
 - Paul had only been to Thessalonica for less than a <u>month</u> when he was forced to leave because of <u>riots</u>.
 - Many were <u>saved</u> in that short time.
 - Paul had heard <u>nothing</u> from the believers in Thessalonica, and about a <u>year</u> later, he sent Timothy to check on them.
 - Paul was $\underline{\text{thrilled}}$ to learn that his brief labors had resulted in a $\underline{\text{thriving}}$ church.
 - I Thessalonians is Paul's <u>letter</u> to the church after Paul had learned of their great $\underline{\text{growth}}$ in grace.
- 2. I Thessalonians is the <u>first</u> Bible epistle written by Paul.
- 3. I Thessalonians is possibly the first New Testament book that was <u>penned</u>.
- 4. Each <u>chapter</u> of I Thessalonians ends with a reference to the Second Coming of Christ. 1:10, 2:19, 3:13, 4:16-18, 5:23.
- 5. The theme of I Thessalonians is "<u>Stedfast</u> in the Lord."
- 6. The <u>key verse</u> is I Thessalonians 3:8.

GREAT TRUTHS

1. We ought to strive to follow up on new believers; nevertheless, the Word of God, once sown, can produce its own <u>results</u>.

2. It should be in our hearts to <u>pray</u> for people that we have been privileged to influence for *Christ.* 1:2, 3:9-10.

3. Never lose the fire of the new believer.
