

"Arise, my people! Let your light

**shine** for all the nations to see! For the glory of the Lord is streaming from you. Darkness as black as night shall cover all the peoples of the earth, but the glory of the Lord will shine from you. All nations will come to your light; mighty kings will come to see the glory of the Lord upon you.

Lift up your eyes and see! For your sons and daughters are coming home to you from distant lands. Your eyes will shine with joy, your hearts will thrill, for merchants from around the world will flow to you, bringing you the wealth of many lands. Vast droves of camels will converge upon you, dromedaries from Midian and Sheba and Ephah too, bringing gold and incense to add to the praise of God."

-Isaiah 60:1-6 (The Living Bible)

Christian poet T.S. Elliott once wrote: "Last year's words belong to last year's language.

And next year's words await another voice."

And as I write this, many of us are either still in the midst of holiday madness, or are just beginning to return to some degree of normalcy—with proverbial scraps of Christmas wrapping paper and tinsel stick to our soles (souls?) while we strive to clean up and "put away" the remnants of the previous year before the new one opens before us.

That's one of the gifts of Epiphany: to celebrate what GOD has shown and spoken to us in the past, while also embracing new revelations from The LORD. But in order for that to happen, we need to be prepared to honestly receive both the former things and forthcoming possibilities.

# "The only thing worse than being blind is having sight but no vision." -Hellen Keller

Consider the passage from Isaiah to the left and how Christians believe it was fulfilled in the arrival of the Magi at the Holy Family's home: in order for it to "make sense" to followers of Jesus, we need to have a familiarity with Jewish history and an ability to perceive how our Creator altered and expanded upon the original prophecy. Furthermore (and more importantly) in both the original vision granted to the prophet and in the consummation thereof there is a RESPONSIVENESS required from GOD's people, in order for Divine Plans to come to fruition.

If I desire all of the nations of the earth to see and believe that Jesus of Nazareth was/is the promised and long-awaited King, then I must actively engage that truth. If I want The LORD to bless 2020, then I need to get off of my tail-end and participate in the *current* methods The Holy One is employing to do so.

You and I must RISE and SHINE -never remaining stagnant, nor hiding Christ's Light.

We are called to OPEN OUR EYES and genuinely SEE/PERCEIVE what is going on around us and what The LORD is up to in the midst of changing realities—never willfully ignoring them, nor failing to do our part.

Epiphany and New Year fall at roughly the same time, and that's a blessing for people of faith. Epiphany asks us to engage a fuller recognition of what The LORD is up to, and then to pass that insight on to those who don't know Christ yet. The new year is just that: NEW, different.

The past is gone and can never be reclaimed. Whether trials or triumphs, what happened in the previously needs to inform the future, but can never enslave or keep us from tomorrow. Especially when GOD transformed "yesterday" (or "used to be" day) into TODAY.

In the days ahead, I would pray that we'd all be like those wise men who followed GOD's guidance: let us be

prepared to **deviate** from our own intended routes/plans when told to do so. Because, not only did the Magi listen-for and respond-to the voice of the Stillspeaking GOD, but they also **added their own gifts** to what was already prophesied (remember: Isaiah never said anything about "myrrh").

MAY THE LORD GRANT YOU & YOURS, & OUR ENTIRE CHURCH FAMILY WITH A FAITHFUL AND FRUITFUL NEW YEAR!


