Part Fifty Four: Parting Words

1 Thessalonians 5:23-28 - PAUL CLOSES HIS LETTER

AN EDIFYING "GOODBYE"

Saying "goodbye" to people we love can be one of the most painful elements of life. Every Spirit-filled believer wants to send people off stronger than they were when we said "hello." Paul shows us some elements of a blessed "goodbye."

1) A CLOSING <u>PRAYER</u>. 5:23 And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Saying goodbye with prayer keeps God at the <u>center</u> of your friendship.

- 2) A CLOSING <u>PROMISE</u>. 5:24 Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it.

 Sharing a promise of God gives <u>hope</u> for the future.
- 3) A CLOSING <u>REQUEST</u>. 5:25 Brethren, pray for us.

 Asking your friends to pray for you reminds them that you <u>need</u> them.
- 4) A CLOSING <u>CHALLENGE</u>. 5:26 Greet all the brethren with an holy kiss. 27 I charge you by the Lord that this epistle be read unto all the holy brethren.

You strengthen fellowship by passing along greetings and words of encouragement.

5) A CLOSING <u>BLESSING</u>. 5:28 The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Amen.

Parting words such as "God bless you" remind your friend of your heart and of God's heart toward them.
