What Is A Parable?

MATTHEW 13:1-3, 10-11

- **13:1** The same day went Jesus out of the house, and sat by the sea side.
- **13:2** And great multitudes were gathered together unto him, so that he went into a ship, and sat; and the whole multitude stood on the shore.
- **13:3** And he spake many things unto them in parables.
- 13:10 And the disciples came, and said unto him, Why speakest thou unto them in parables?
- **13:11** He answered and said unto them, Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given.
- 1. The word "parable" comes from the Greek word "paraballo", which means "to throw <u>along side</u>" and "to <u>reach</u> a <u>place</u>."
- 2. The dictionary definition, "an allegorical representation of something from real life, from which a moral is drawn for instruction," does not quite explain the <u>purpose</u> of Jesus' parables.
- 3. Jesus' parables presented a <u>physical</u> example to which people could relate, so that they could also relate to a <u>spiritual</u> truth.
- 4. Jesus' parables used <u>pictures</u> from THIS world's kingdom, to paint pictures of HIS <u>kingdom</u>.
- 5. A Bible parable is a story that <u>everyone</u> understands, that is laid <u>parallel</u> to a truth that we do not yet understand.
- 6. People who make no effort to <u>seek</u> God's kingdom have no <u>context</u> to understand Christ's parables.
- 7. The parables which we will study about the kingdom of God use pictures from this <u>life</u>, which we HAVE seen, to help us understand a <u>new</u> life which we have NOT yet seen.
