Folsom Project For the Visually Impaired

A District 4-C5 501(c)3 non-profit organization that is dedicated to providing quality service to the blind, visually impaired, and the learning disable communities. It includes free Braille transcription; closed captioning on video tapes; books on tape; and eyeglasses.

Vision Screening Unit
