From The Community Spiritual Director

I was recently reading a devotion based on the story found in the 6th chapter of Mark when one word jumped off the page at me. The 45th verse says, "Immediately Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd." Which word caught my attention? Made. Jesus *made* the disciples get into the boat. My experience is that Jesus doesn't make us do anything. Certainly, he gives us direction and lets us know the path to take, but *make* us? I've always believed that we have free will to do as we please, be obedient or not. I get the visual here of Jesus holding a gun on the disciples, not that I believe he did anything of that nature, but you can see where I'm coming from.

Anyway, here's where that thought led me. If Jesus is making, or even suggesting that I do so and so it's probably a good idea to do as he says. If I follow his leading, I can rest assured that it will be smooth sailing from here on out. After all, he's not going to make me do anything that will cause me anxiety, pain, failure, discomfort, or have any negative repercussion, right?

Well, look at what happens when the disciples do what Jesus *makes* them do. "He saw them straining at the oars, because the wind was against them" (verse 48). Sometimes we as Christians believe that if we are obedient, if we do what we're supposed to do, if we do what God tells us, we will be immune from troubles. Ask Paul, Peter, John, or any of the other saints (as well as modern day saints) how that worked out for them. Even Jesus, as he obeyed the Father lived a life filled with rejection, pain, sacrifice, death, even a cruel death on the cross. However, did he accomplish his mission? Absolutely! So, as you carry out the work prepared in advance for you (Ephesians 2:10), know that the words of Jesus in John 16:33 are as true today as when he spoke them. "In this world you will have trouble." Is anybody having any trouble in this world? If you're not, God bless you. Hang on. It's coming.

The second half of that verse is also true today. "Take heart, I have overcome the world." He has also made us overcomers through the power of his Holy Spirit. We have a mission, just as Jesus had a mission. May we carry ours out in the face of "the wind being against us" as well as He carried out his.

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
