WATER TANK REPLACEMENT UPDATE

Great progress is being made on our Water Tank Replacement Project. Three tanks have been replaced and they are in the last stages of being brought online. Jim Tank located on High Court will be the last tank to be painted and if the weather is cooperative painting should be finished by mid-November. Next year we will be replacing three more tanks one of which will be

Kennedy Tank, our largest one million gallon tank located on the corner of Beach Road and Shelter Cove Road.

FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Burning Restriction Now Lifted:

The State lifted the burning ban but fire conditions in Shelter Cove can still be unsafe due to wind and our warm micro-climate. Please call our office at 986-7447 during regular business hours or the Fire Dept @ 986-7507 for local fire conditions and call AQMD at 1-866-287-6329 for burn day information for Shelter Cove (Zone 1) after 5 p.m. the day prior to burning.

Burning is only allowed on authorized Air Quality Management District (AQMD) burn days between 6 a.m. and noon with a valid AQMD burn permit on-site. Permits run from January to December, take a week to process and permit applications are available at the Fire Station/District office. Mail completed applications and the permit fee (\$20 for a Standard Burn Permit) to the AQMD office referenced on the permit application. Please call the local AQMD office at (707) 443-3093 for further details.

Fire Extinguisher Recharge:

The community may bring their fire extinguishers to the Fire House or District office on the morning of Thursday, December 13th, for recharging by Eureka-Humboldt Fire Extinguisher. If you have any questions, please call them - Their phone number is 822-2517. The cost of this service will depend on the unit size.

Seasonal Reminder:

Please ready your homes and vehicles for the winter season: Clean your chimneys and gutters, make sure your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms have working batteries, be extra careful with candles, and have water, snacks, blankets, and other emergency supplies close at hand. Slow down when driving as you may have to unexpectedly negotiate hazards such as rocks, fallen trees and deer on the roads.
