Joy's Breakfast Cookies

Stir together:

2 c brown sugar

2 ½ c oats

4 c flour

1 Tb baking soda

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp salt

1 ½ tsp cinnamon

Make well and pour in:

½ c canola oil

2 Tb water

5 egg whites

1 ½ tsp vanilla

Stir in:

3/4 c raisins

1/4 c chopped prunes

or apricots

1/4 c chopped dates

½ c chopped nuts

Scoop golf ball size dough onto greased baking sheet. Flatten to ½ with wet hands. Bake 9-10 minutes in 350 degree oven.


