

LITURGY CORNERDecember 12 - THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

December 6 - St. Lucy, Virgin, Martyr

December 7 - St. John of the Cross, Priest, Doctor of the Church

Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as *Gaudete* Sunday, *Gaudete* "Rejoice", taken from the Latin translation of Philippians 4:4-5, "*Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near.*" It sets a tone of joyful expectation for the Lord's birth and Second Coming, as does the permitted use of rose-colored vestments.

December 12 Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe:

Our Lady first appeared to Saint Juan Diego on December 9, 1531, as he hurried to morning Mass near Mexico City. She communicated to Juan that she wished to have a church built and to be acknowledged as the Mother of the True God.

On the 12th of December, Juan Diego collected roses in his cloak as a sign to take to the Bishop. Unfurling his cloak in front of the Bishop, Juan Diego revealed a miraculous image of the Virgin; this image hangs in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City.



Since 12 December falls on a Sunday, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is replaced by the Third Sunday of Advent. Our Lady of Guadalupe will be honored at all our Sunday masses.

Saint Lucy martyred around the year 303 in Syracuse, is one of the fifteen saints mentioned after the consecration in the canon of the Mass. The fifteen saints are martyrs, for "saint" in the early Church referred to those who witnessed to Christ by their blood. Because of her name, she is the patroness of those afflicted with diseases of the eye and associated with festivals of light.

Saint John of the Cross joined the Carmelites in 1563. His mystical theology teaches the renunciation of all creaturely comforts for the sake of union with God. *"Feed not your spirit on anything but God. Cast off concern about things, and bear peace and recollection in your heart."* *"At the evening of our life we will be judged on love,"* John said; he died in 1591 and is hailed as the Mystical Doctor.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Shout for joy! Sing joyfully! Be glad and exult! The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior (Zephaniah 3:14-18a).

Psalm — Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel (Isaiah 12).

Second Reading — Rejoice! The Lord is near. Make your requests known to God (Philippians 4:4-7).

Gospel — John tells his hearers to share their possessions with the needy; be honest; do not threaten or accuse others falsely (Luke 3:10-18).

Brothers and Sisters,

On this 3rd Sunday of Advent let's talk about one of our most popular Advent traditions: The lighting of the Advent wreath. Its origin is in pre-Christian Germany and Scandinavia to celebrate the return of the sun after the winter solstice. For us, the lighting of the Advent candles represents the promise of the coming of Jesus, the light of the world. As the candlelight of the Advent wreath glows, we share the expectation of Isaiah, John the Baptist and Mary for the fulfillment of God's promise to send a savior. We look forward to the coming of Jesus who pierces the darkness of our sins by the light of his love.



Today we light the 3rd candle of our Advent wreath, the one rose colored candle. Today is "Gaudete Sunday" and as a sign of our joyful anticipation of the coming of Jesus, purple is replaced not only in the candles of our wreath, but in the vestments of our priests and the liturgical color of our church. This Sunday is also called "Rejoice Sunday" and takes its name and theme from the first word of our second reading "Rejoice" (Gaudete). The reading itself proclaims the reality that the glorified Jesus is near.

As Christmas gets closer, have you been watching your children? Maybe they have been told that Santa has a book and "he's checking it twice, he's going to find out whose been naughty or nice." It seems the harder they try to be good, the more anxious they get and the harder it becomes to be good! And, like our children, we begin Advent with lots of good intentions, confident this year, everything will be calm and peaceful. However, three weeks into Advent our bodies are tired out and our nerves shot. A word of comfort from the Lord can refresh tired bodies and lift weary spirits. Listen for that word of comfort in a gentle word of encouragement from a loved one. In turn, speak it to someone who needs reassurance.

Today's readings repeatedly echo with words and sounds of joy and gladness. In our first reading the prophet Zephaniah proclaims to Judah that despite the people's many infidelities God will renew Judah "in his love" (Zph. 3:17). St Paul in our second reading tells the Philippian community to "rejoice in the Lord always", for the Lord is near.

In the gospel of Luke, we hear the simple and clear message of John the Baptist: Repent! John's mission was to bring God's people to faith and in turn challenge them to repentance. Today he addresses various groups of people in the crowd. Tax collectors were told to stop collecting more than what was fair and lawful. Anything they collected over and above what was lawful was considered their commission. This practice usually resulted in the tax collectors gouging the poor. The soldiers were told to act justly and honestly, not to extort others, or falsely accuse anyone and to be satisfied by what were their wages. The people in general were to act justly towards the poor, sharing their extra cloak with someone without one. The same with their food. Put another way, share what you have with your neighbor-share your respect, your kindness, your material goods. By doing so, you spread "joy". In doing these things we are sharing the joy we know in the Lord. We are preparing the way of the Lord by serving others. Final thoughts: Traditionally on December 12th, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Of all the apparitions of Mary, this is the only one in which no warnings were given, no disasters predicted. Mary in her simplicity says to Juan Diego in his native language the words, "Am I not your mother?"

TERCER Domingo DE Adviento
12 DE DICIEMBRE DE 2021

ALEGRARSE

A este domingo se le conoce como el Domingo Gaudete o Domingo de la Alegría, este otro nombre en latín para este día está tomado de la antigua Antífona de Entrada aprobada para hoy: "Alérgense siempre en el Señor; una vez más digo, alérgense. En efecto, el Señor está cerca". La ropa litúrgica u ornamentos usados opcionalmente para hoy de color rosa tratan de representar al cielo de las madrugadas de invierno cuando ya está cerca el solsticio, la música festiva del órgano, los arreglos florales, todas estas antiguas tradiciones, junto con la antífona, pretenden anticipar, en la vista y en el sonido, la alegría de la Navidad que pronto sucederá. Qué bien ilustran las Escrituras de hoy la lucha entre los estados de ánimo contrastados del Adviento: la "alegre expectación" ante la Natividad de Cristo, y el "serio arrepentimiento" inspirado por la predicación de Juan el Bautista, que nos recuerda que la próxima venida de Cristo, en la muerte o al final de los tiempos, será para juzgar y redimir.

ALEGRÍA Y JÚBILO

La alegría y el júbilo resuenan en la primera lectura, ya que la antigua profecía mesiánica de Sofonías presenta a Dios "alegrándose por nosotros, renovándonos en su amor, cantando con alegría por nosotros como se canta en las fiestas". Este Dios alegre no está distante: el profeta declara dos veces que Dios "está en medio de ustedes". Sofonías confía tanto en el amor de este Dios alegre por nosotros que declara que nuestra liberación es "un hecho": tanto del miedo y la culpa internos, "el Señor ha quitado el juicio contra ustedes", como de las amenazas externas: "ha alejado a tus enemigos". El Salmo Responsorial, del profeta principal del Adviento, Isaías, se hace eco de una alegría jubilosa que debería impulsarnos a estar "confiados y sin miedo", "porque entre ustedes está el grande y Santo de Israel". Pablo también exhorta a los filipenses, y a nosotros, a la alegría, a una bondad que debe ser evidente para todos, a una oración libre de ansiedad, serena y agradecida.

¿QUÉ DEBEMOS HACER?

Pero entonces Juan el Bautista grita en la orilla del Jordán: ¡Arrepíntanse! Prepárense para un Mesías que bautizará "con el Espíritu Santo y fuego"; a diferencia del bautismo de Juan con agua, transformará por completo a sus destinatarios. Su horquilla limpiará la madera muerta, agrupando el trigo y quemando la paja en un fuego que no se extingue. Si esto va a ser una "Buena Nueva" para nosotros, entonces bien podríamos, como las multitudes, los recaudadores de impuestos y los soldados que escucharon por primera vez a Juan preguntar "¿Qué debemos hacer?" Cuando Juan responde a la gente de entonces, y a nosotros hoy, la respuesta, aunque supremamente desafiante, es casi sorprendentemente sencilla. A nadie se le ordena que abandone el lugar en el que el camino personal de su vida o las realidades de una historia más allá de su control le han puesto. Dios nos salva, no a pesar de las circunstancias de nuestra vida real ni al margen de ellas, sino en ellas y a través de ellas. Nuestra llamada ahora es a la caridad práctica y generosa: debemos compartir ropa y comida; practicar la justicia y la integridad profesional y personal; y ser honestos con los demás y con nosotros mismos. Tal es la enseñanza del Mesías que Juan anunció.

INFORMACIÓN LITÚRGICA

12 de diciembre - TERCER DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO

13 de diciembre - Santa Lucía, virgen y mártir

14 de diciembre - San Juan de la Cruz, presbítero y doctor de la Iglesia

El tercer domingo de Adviento se conoce tradicionalmente como el Domingo de *Gaudete*, *Gaudete "Alegría"*, tomado de la traducción latina de Filipenses 4:4-5, "Estén siempre alegres en el Señor; se lo repito, estén alegres y den a todos muestras de un espíritu muy abierto. El Señor está cerca."

Establece un tono de alegre expectación por el nacimiento del Señor y la Segunda Venida, al igual que el uso permitido de vestiduras sacerdotiales de color rosa.

12 de diciembre Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe:

La Virgen se apareció por primera vez a San Juan Diego el 9 de diciembre de 1531, mientras él se apresuraba a ir a la misa matutina cerca de la Ciudad de México. Ella le dijo a Juan Diego que deseaba que se construyera una iglesia y que se la reconociera como la Madre del verdadero Dios.

El 12 de diciembre, Juan Diego recogió rosas en su manto como señal para llevar al Obispo. Juan Diego desplegó su manto ante el Obispo, y reveló una imagen milagrosa de la Virgen; esta imagen cuelga en la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México.

El 12 de diciembre cae en domingo, la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe se sustituye por el tercer domingo de Adviento. La Virgen de Guadalupe será honrada en todas nuestras misas dominicales.



Santa Lucía, martirizada hacia el año 303 en Siracusa, es una de los quince santos mencionados tras la consagración en el canon de la misa. Los quince santos son mártires, ya que "santo" en la Iglesia primitiva se refería a los que daban testimonio de Cristo con su sangre. Por su nombre, es la patrona de los ciegos y abogada de los problemas de la vista y está asociada a las fiestas de la luz.

San Juan de la Cruz se unió a los carmelitas en 1563. Su teología mística enseña la renuncia a todas las comodidades de las criaturas en aras de la unión con Dios. "No alimentes tu espíritu con otra cosa que no sea Dios. Desecha la preocupación por las cosas, y lleva la paz y el recogimiento en tu corazón". "Al atardecer de nuestra vida seremos juzgados por el amor", dijo Juan; murió en 1591 y es aclamado como el Doctor Místico.


