Music City News Album Review - August 1989

Ain't Gonna Cry

"This versatile songstress proves with her swan song RCA LP why she has remained one of musicdom's most consistent hitmakers. Showing her usual wide-ranging musical abilities, the singer effortlessly glides from the rollicking When Love Comes Around The Bend to the soft and romantic The Moment You Were Mine. A delightful remake of the classic (And) Then He Kissed Me is a treat as is the Otha Young/Johnny Pierce written Say You'll Be Mine. Though she will no longer make her home with ole Nipper, chances are she'll always find a warm welcome from country fans." (RCA 8376-4-R) (Williams).

Following are a few of Juice's recent appearances here and there across the country:

* Early in June, Juice was featured with Leeza Gibbons of Entertainment Tonight, showing Leeza and all expectant mothers watching, how to do some safe and helpful exercises during pregnancy to make their days a little easier. In our area this was shown on ABC (Chan. 8). We hope a lot of you caught the show because Juice was great and made it look so easy!

* On July 22nd she appeared on American Bandstand. She never sang better and never looked better. She sang Only Walkin' first, wearing a brilliant sky-blue full length dress. Her second song was, (And) Then He Kissed Me, and this time she was smartly dressed in a pant suit with a hot pink satin top over black pants and on her head was a striking black Stetson. Her performance and appearance were impressive indeed, and those young people really danced to her music!

* On August 12th Juice made a guest appearance for a Rodeo Benefit at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center. Later in the week this benefit was featured on Crook & Chase, Nashville, and Juice made a short statement about the benefit saying she would be singing later on in the program. (We admire Juice for her willingness to always participate in benefits that help those who really need help!!)

An amusing personal tidbit for all our 8-yr-old JNFC Members!

On July 21st I took the Ain't Gonna Cry cassette to my 8-year-old great-granddaughter, Kristi Young who was

playing with her 8-year-old cousin, Timmy Jenkins at their grandmother's home. CENTER STAGE, NASHVILLE JUICE SQUEEZES OUT TIME FOR WORK AND HOME

"Life as a country-star mother of a 2 year old is all a matter of deciding priorities," says Juice Newton. Jessica Ann, the two and a half year old daughter of Juice and Tom Goodspeed, has become 'roadworthy and hotel wise' during her travels with her mom. Juice took time Tuesday for a telephone interview about balancing the obligations of career and family. "I don't feel that a reconciliation is needed,"she said, "I think a decision is needed that I can do both of these things. Your priorities are put in line more directly ... is it more important to hang out or to go to Disneyland?" Lately, the Disneyland side of the equation has been getting more attention. "I've been able to maintain so far, but it is not a piece of cake," said Newton whose second child is due in November. "Your days get longer and your nights get shorter. Whenever you take on the responsibility of a family, you can't be as selfish." Newton has lessened her touring pace somewhat since she was scoring early 80's hits, but that's partly because of a broken back suffered in a fall from a horse the year her daughter was born. On

the LP Ain't Gonna Cry there's a rousing remake of the 1963 Crystal's hit, (And) Then He Kissed Me. Despite her extensive success with remakes, Newton's not an oldies fanatic. In fact, she's a folkie at heart, she explains in discussing the standout album cut, I'm Only Walkin'. "That's a fun song, very reminiscent of the music I started in, which was folk music,"she said. Performances on her forthcoming tour, which includes a Nashville stop Tuesday, will include material from all phases of Newton's career." (Sent in by JNFC Member, Buddy Scott, Nashville, TN.)

"Catching Up On Fun With Juice" by Mick La Salle Staff Writer for the San Francisco Chronicle, July 14th, at the Solano County Fair Concert, Vallejo, California.

"I gave myself two hours to drive the 30-something miles from San Francisco to Vallejo to see Juice Newton's concert at the Solano County Fair. I figured I'd get there a good hour before the second show, browse

around a bit, win a few stuffed animals, etc., but Friday night between 7 and 9 o'clock there was a 30-mile traffic jam on interstate 80, stop-and go all the way from Oakland to the Carqueniz bridge. By the time I parked the heap at the fairgrounds, ran like a maniac and got to the outdoor theater, Newton and her five-man band, were already 10 minutes into their show. I turned to the woman next to me and asked her what I'd missed. "Heart Of The Night and Angel Of The Morning," she said. Terrific! Just the two songs I was singing in the shower all week, like a happy idiot."

Accompanying herself on guitar, Newton sang Ride 'Em Cowboy, one of her country hits, and when she finished, she actually thanked the audience for sitting through it. "Not a lot of audiences will sit still for acoustic material." Her voice sounds something like Rosanne Cash's, only stronger but there's a psychological complexity about Cash, while Newton stays on the surface, catchy, pleasant, and, occasionally, delightful. She makes music everybody likes. Queen Of Hearts isn't played much at parties, but rolling down the road with the windows up, we've all sung it."

She sang I'm Only Walkin' (a new song about a little girl talking about her home town.) and then she played a few fast numbers that had people dancing in the isles She got a standing ovation for 'Hurt', and then closed with Queen Of Hearts, with a nice little yodel in her voice. She came back and did her biggest country hit, The Sweetest Thing. It's one of the few songs Newton performs that sounds inspired by emotion, rather than a desire to be fun."

"Dear Juice Newton: I want to tell you a small story. It is about a little boy of 13 years. The year was 1983 and this boy was in the 7th grade. He had friends, a lot of them, in

fact. But he had very little self-esteem and virtually no confidence. These personality faults along with feelings of unwantedness, aloneness, and fear of the future, constituted a suicide attempt . . . a thankfully unsuccessful one. The boy's life was bleek and undefined. He found himself lost and washed up at 13.

This little boy's escape was in the walls of his bedroom, where he could lock the door and find some kind of sanctuary in his record collection. He enjoyed listening to his albums, all 5 of them. It was one of his few pleasures in his then-pathetic life.

This boy, to this day feels he owes a part of himself to

the singer of those records, in part for helping him cope with the hard times and also for being there when he needed her voice to soothe and comfort him.

Today, 6 long bitter-sweet years later, that boy who almost died by his own hand has recently graduated high school and will be entering college in the fall in hopes of becoming a psychologist or a school teacher.

He has become something that he once was not . . .

happy!

The boy is (and was) me. The heroine in disguise as a

singer is you, Ms Newton!





Intoducing Brenda Jenkins Lewisville, Texas



Juice, **stunning** in a lovely soft pink dressy dress, performing at **Center Stage** in Nashville. We got a call from Nashville telling us this was a **b e a u t i f u l** concert!
