

Emails re Fire Safety

3/3/17

From the NSC:

I am attaching pictures from earlier this morning of the current state of the landscaping of LCC on Charleston Street.

Several neighbors whose property is contiguous with LCC's yard have voiced their concern over the growth of weeds, cut trees/shrubs left unmoved and the potential for fire in the area as the weather continues to improve and the vegetation dries. With the heavy rains we have experienced, it is understandable that the growth is unusually high, but with this the need for tending to the area is vital. In addition, there are two very elderly individuals with homes facing this area and they, too, are nervous about the aspect of a potential fire, as their mobility has decreased.

Bruce Rucker did some trimming this week, which is appreciated, but there is still much more that needs to be done.

Please note also that the gate to the leaning fence is often pushed open and left ajar. There have been times when young adults have entered your private property and left the gate open.

Please let me know your thoughts and when some work might be started. I will advise the neighbors accordingly.

I wanted to reach out to you to determine if and when there might be some work done to clear the drying vegetation on the LCC property that we had previously communicated on.

Please let me know, as neighbors are very concerned about the potential fire danger with the area's weeds and overgrowth continuing and the warming of temperatures.

5/18/17
