RID BOARD HIRE NEW GM

Justin Robbins has accepted the General Manager's position and will begin his contract on May 21st, 2018. Justin will be in attendance at the May 17th regular board meeting where the public will have an opportunity to meet him. Justin is a long-time Shelter Cove resident and comes with public agency work experience. We would all like to welcome him to his new position with the District.

WATER TANK CONSTRUCTION TO BEGIN

The Board of Directors took action on March 26th to award the Water Tank Replacement Project to Farr Construction, dba: Resource Development Company. Construction is scheduled to begin on May 23rd with demolition of Jim Tank on High View Court and Lar Tank on Hillside. Jerry Tank on Willow Glen will be demolished after the new tank has been built next to the old one. A minimum of three tanks are going to be replaced this year. Construction activity will be allowed between 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on week days and 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on weekends. No work will occur on holidays. This first year of the two-year project will be substantially completed by October 15th, before the rains begin.

GREASE AND TRASH DISPOSAL

We have been experiencing serious damage to sewer lift pumps caused by items flushed down the toilet, so please refrain from using your toilet as a trash basket. Please avoid using the sewer system to dispose of greasy food scraps. Pouring grease and oil into the sewer pipes can cause the wastewater system to backflow into homes and businesses. The proper way to dispose of fats, cooking oils and grease is to place into a container and dispose of them in the garbage.

DISTRICT RECEIVES DISASTER RELIEF

ASSISTANCE

The District applied for federal disaster aid last winter for costs related to storm damage to the District's infrastructure. This included damage to underground power lines, a sewer main, and an access road and culvert. The District received \$201,890 at the end of April to cover the costs related to repairing damage to the underground power lines and is hopeful it will receive the remainder of the reimbursement claim by the beginning of summer.

GOLF GREENS NOTICE

Recently, a group of children have been seen playing on the golf greens with their toys. Please refrain from this practice. Great care is taken to try and keep the golf greens playable. Not only is this detrimental to the condition of the greens but it puts the children at risk of being injured by golf balls.

AIRPORT NEWS

The airport taxiway slurry coat and seal project will be underway later this summer after being held up for a time with a change of consultants. The District received a grant in the amount of \$192,000 and is on track to complete this project by the end of summer. The facility will be shut down while the work is being done, which should take a few weeks.
