Jeremiah 17:9 says, "The heart is deceitful above all things, And desperately wicked; Who can know it?" (NKJV) We live in a world corrupted by sin. The good news is that people are not as evil as they could be were sin allowed to run unfettered. But the bad news is that sin surrounds us and sometimes rears its head more stunningly than at other times. The display of evil that we've seen recently serve as a reminder to us of how desperately people need the Gospel that alone can bring peace and contentment.

Images of the events of October 7 in Israel astound our hearts, images that threaten to plunge the world into chaos. Conflict is a direct result of sinful hearts colliding with each other. In John 14:27 we have the assuring words of our Savior when He said, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." (NKJV) Though Jesus often affirmed the sinfulness of the people He came to save, he assured us that peace in our hearts is achievable through Him. The news is fearsome, but Jesus offers peace to all those who trust Him as Savior.

Closer to home, in Maine, we saw evil surface recently in horrendous ways as a gunman with yet unknown motives killed many and injured many others in a small town in Maine. The despair experienced by those directly impacted by this shocking disregard for human life can barely be adequately described in words. But the fact remains, that even for those who lost loved ones and friends to that horrific event can find peace of heart through Jesus Christ.

Let's pray this week that believers living proximate to these events will come alongside those with desperate need for peace. Pray that this evil will not have final say, but that the Gospel will provide the resource people need as the aftermath of these tragedies unfold. Yes, evil abounds, but the Gospel overcomes the evil. John 16:33 says, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."(NKJV)

Charlotte Digges "Lottie" Moon was an American Southern Baptist missionary to China with the Foreign Mission Board who spent nearly 40 years living and working in China.

The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering is an annual offering collected by Southern Baptists to support international missions. The offering was officially named in 1918 by Woman's Missionary Union in honor of the missionary to China who urged churches to start it and give sacrificially.

Our ladies from Women on Missions will prepare dinner this night, serving different types of chili. Standard, spicy, maybe even white...
