BENGAL KITTEN CARE

To ensure that our kittens get the best care when transitioning from our cattery to new owner, I have set out some important guidelines to help smooth out the transition.

1. Introduce your kitten to just one room at first and let her/him get used to that one room and where she/he is at.
2. Let her/him freely investigate the room to feel comfortable there.
3. Make sure the kitten knows where her/his kitty litter box is (I use and recommend unscented kitty litter, at least until she/he is a year old). I use Purina Tidy Cats Free & Clean Unscented.
4. Continue feeding the kitten what she/he has been fed by breeder (Royal Canin Mother & Babycat graduating to Royal Canin Kitten at four months old) until the kitten is a year old. Always have dry food (Mother and Babycat) and fresh water available (place at least four/five feet or so from the kitty litter box).
5. For Breeders Only: I also recommend "NuVet Plus" vitamin supplements for cats that will eventually be breeding (www.nuvet.com).
6. Register immediately with a Veterinarian to get a comprehensive examination (within four days of receipt) and ensure the next set of kitten shots, in addition to yearly comprehensive examinations and care are scheduled. Note: Retain a copy of this physical for return purposes.
7. Gently play with kitten so she/he gets used to your companionship (getting on the floor with her/him at first gives her/him comfort that you are on their level and assurance of your friendship).
8. Make sure she/he has plenty of toys to entertain with while you are away.
9. Always show your kitten love and she/he will return that a hundred-fold back to you.
