to dry before the sun;*

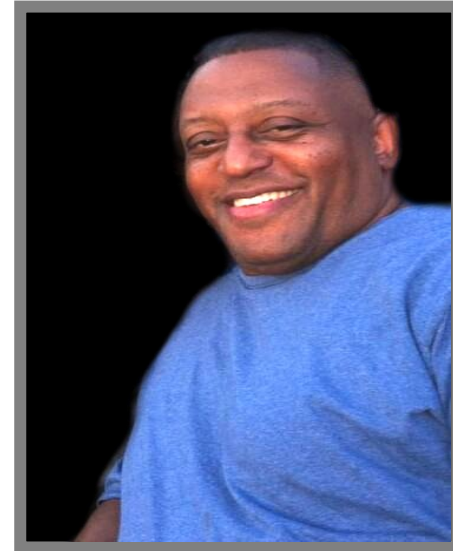
