From The Community Spiritual Director

Responsibility. Vows. Duty. Obligation. Desire. We all have responsibilities in life. Most of us have taken vows at some time or another. We have duties to fulfill, to family, work, church, community, and various other groups. We are obligated to live by the law of the society we are a part of. But what about desire? Do we have a desire to fulfill our responsibilities, our vows, our duties, and our obligations? There are so many distractions in our life. There are so many options of where we can be, what we can do, who we can be with. Sometimes (often?) our desires are so much stronger to do what we want than what we know we should do, what are our duties and obligations. When I am asked to perform a wedding, I try my best to make sure that the prospective couple understand the vows that they are making to each other and to God. I consider these to be serious vows. When they stand together before their friends and family and promise to love and keep each other no matter the circumstances, I tell them that there are major consequences to breaking these vows. I believe our society has made it far too easy to walk away from promises that we make in the wedding vows. When we join a church, we usually also make vows. In my tradition we promise to support the local church by our presence, our gifts, our prayers, our service, and our witness. If the wedding vows are easy to break the church vows are far easier. No one seems to hold us accountable once we make these vows. I once heard that the church is the only organization that expects nothing from its members. We can attend when we want, we can take part or not, we can show up on Sunday morning, sneak in and sneak out without any interaction. The vows we take are promises to God and to our church family. We need to take them seriously. This is a big part of the reason for the Emmaus walks. Remember, we are to grow leaders for the local church. We are to strengthen the local church. I know, someone hurt your feelings. Someone asked you to be on a committee, or someone did not ask you to be on a committee. The preacher didn't shake your hand on Sunday morning. Something was said or done or not said or not done. Regardless, our vows were to support our church. I would encourage you to look in the mirror and ask yourself how you are doing. I love the old question, "What would my church look like if every member looked like me?" And, while you're at it, ask yourself how you are doing at supporting your Emmaus community. We don't take vows promising to support the community, but we know what a difference our walk made in our life. Do you have a desire to give back? Right now, we are approaching the spring walks. Have you thought about who you might sponsor? I just got information this week that the Lexington, Kentucky community has had to cancel their upcoming men's walk. Not enough pilgrims. We may not have an obligation, but I believe we have a responsibility and I hope we have a desire to serve in any way we can and that would certainly include sponsorship. Let's think seriously about our responsibility as brothers and sisters to support, to serve, and to love one another.
