TERMINOLOGY NOTES

In a recent class we had some discussion about the term *slath*. The initial layout of the base is referred to as the slath. A flexible weaver or weavers are used to tie in the slath, which stabilizes the spokes so they can be separated to form a round or oval base.

Merriam-Webster defines the slath (noun) as the center of the bottom of a basket where the weaving is begun that is formed by crossing sticks at right angles and binding them.

The term refers to any base where the spokes are crossed whether they are overlaid or split-spoke (one set of spokes split in the middle, the perpendicular spokes are threaded through the slit.)

Upsett—is the term used to describe the point at which the side spokes are pinched and bent upward to form the sides.

Smoked Reed—is commercially dyed brown reed. Originally produced in Sumatra by a special process using heat and ammonia. Today the reed is dyed commercially and will run so it's best to rinse it several times, otherwise it will bleed onto adjoining materials. **Cheers, Karen O**

2024 GBB Retreat Classes

Wednesday, May 15, 2024 Sampler Twined Basket Ann Taylor Class/Material Fee - \$65

This round reed basket is made on a 5 1/2" cherry wood base. A variety of 3 rod, 4 rod, and 5 rod patterns in a multitude of colors will result in a unique sampler basket. Tools: awl, sharp scissors, needle nose pliers, spray bottle, soaking tub.

Wednesday, May 15, 2024 Coiled Yarn Basket Gayle Still Class/Material Fee - \$50

Coiling with yarn around a core using just two stitches is a meditative way to create color, patterns and shape for a basket. The use of yarn is a great stash buster for spinners, knitters and crocheters, although raffia works well with this technique also. Embellishments will be discussed and feathers provided to end our basket. Tools: Scissors



Thursday, May 16, 2024 Twined Basket Ann Taylor Class/Material Fee - \$60

Using one pattern from the sampler basket and a color of your choice, make a basket on a 5 1/2" cherry wood base. A decorative rim will finish off the basket. Tools: awl, sharp scissors, needle nose pliers, spray bottle, soaking tub.

Pine Needle Basket/with Leather Center
Nettie Fox
Class/Material Fee -\$50

Students will learn how to coil pine needles onto a 3" leather center with your color choice of synthetic sinew, while also learning different decorative stitches and wrapping techniques.

Beads, shells, and feathers will be available to use as embellishments, or bring your own.

Tools: Small sharp scissors.

- Regular meeting at Sparks Masonic Center. The meeting was called to order at 10:10 am by Betty Hulse. 14 attending; 3
- Karen Olson reported there is a total of \$1716.76 in checking and \$6902.76 in savings in the treasury as of the end of October. Reminder that dues for next year should be paid within the next couple of months.
