# COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- Started construction on a new school in Dani, Mali.
- Continued construction of the second story of a community center in Muenala, Ecuador.
- Provided paint to the school in Tangali, Ecuador, to re-paint traditional games on the school grounds.
- Provided materials to make a covered Ecua-volleyball court in the community of Agualongo, Ecuador.

# EDUCATION

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- Secondary education scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 91 students to attend high school. 17 students graduated this year!
- Higher education scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 24 students to attend universities and technical institutes. 2 students graduated this year!

- Professional scholarships in Mali through the Dr. Ash B. Varma, M.D. Scholarship Program that allowed 37 students to study for professional work that is needed in their region. 1 student graduated this year!
- Tommo So Literacy program for 300 women in Mali.
- Leadership workshops for 100 women in Mali.
- Student Mothers program in Mali for 5 young mothers.
- Creation of a program to enable 75 internally displaced children to attend school in Bandiagara, Mali.
- In-person summer school program for 20 students in Ecuador.
- Support for the school in Quichinche, Ecuador to

- paint the school, install a bike rack, and build a hand-washing station thanks to an exchange program with Sharon High School.
- Support for teachers at the elementary schools in Yarou Plateau and Andjine, Mali.
- Support for a music and art teacher at the elementary school in Urkusiki, Ecuador.
- Taught one course for Whitman College, on Andean and Western Healthcare in Otavalo, Ecuador.

# ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION AND FOOD SECURITY

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- A week-long Gardening Volunteer Venture in Ecuador to collaborate with communities and schools on planting native trees and food crops.
- Creation of 5 new school gardens in Mali.
- Started construction of 2 new grain banks in Mali.
- Support for the Olouguelemo Environmental Association, which led to the following projects:
  - Built more than 19,600 meters worth of stone contour lines to prevent erosion and retain water in the soil.
  - Practiced assisted natural regeneration on 17,387 trees.
  - Held a training session on making improved cookstoves. Made 282 stoves.
  - Protected more than 2,725 acres of forests.
  - Planted 757 trees.

# HEALTH CARE

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- Creation of a menstrual kit workshop in Bandiagara, Mali.
- Providing school first aid stations to 2 schools in Mali.

- Donations of medical supplies to the Otavalo Hospital thanks to a donation from Boston Scientific.
- One-day medical clinics in the Ecuadorian communities of Minas Chupa, Padre Chupa, Muenala, and Cambugan.
- Community Health and Well-being Program in Ecuador:

- 209 patients received support with medical follow-up care.
- 15 patients received support with vision follow-up care.
- 11 patients received glasses.
- 14 months’ supply of baby formula was delivered to 2 infants.
- 11 patients received hearing devices.
- 3 patients accessed surgeries.



**“T**hrough the foundation, we have been able to reach many specialists so that they can care for our son and do the tests he needs. They helped me get hearing aids, and with them my son’s life changed completely. The reaction that he has is very different than before. # INCOME GENERATION

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- Five new women’s associations received startup funding to start businesses in market gardening, indigo dyeing, and transforming cotton into cloth.
- A cotton and indigo bank in Dassi, Mali was completed.



**I** am the president of the Monbibieño association of women dyers from the village of Goundoly Djeninké. It is thanks to the support of The Tandana Foundation that we were able to create this association, and we hold our association with both hands. Today, thanks to the association, we get orders for our cloth all the way from coastal countries such as Côte d’Ivoire. # WATER RESOURCES

## IN 2022, WE WERE PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- Near completion of a new potable water system in Inguincho, Ecuador.
- Construction of a reservoir in Moe-Leye, Mali.
- Expansion of 13 ponds in Mali. We provided emergency food support and tools so that residents of 31 villages could expand 13 ponds, thus conserving more water that they can use for gardening and livestock.

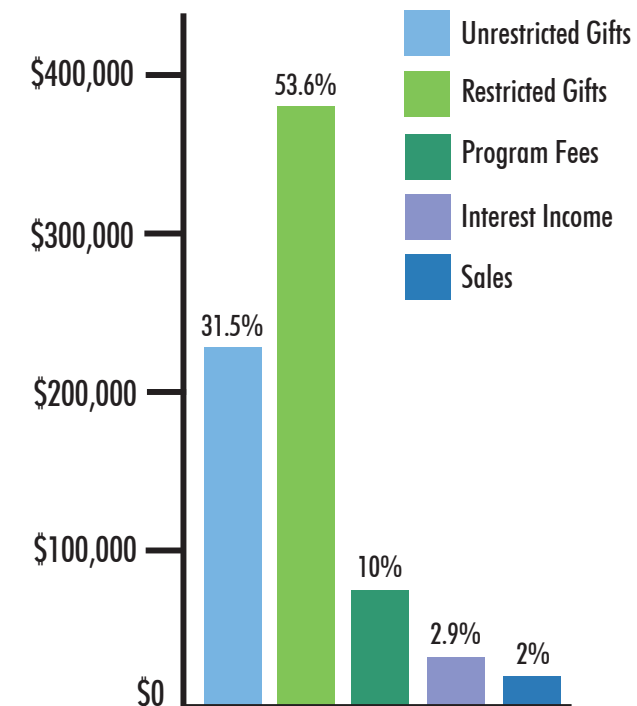

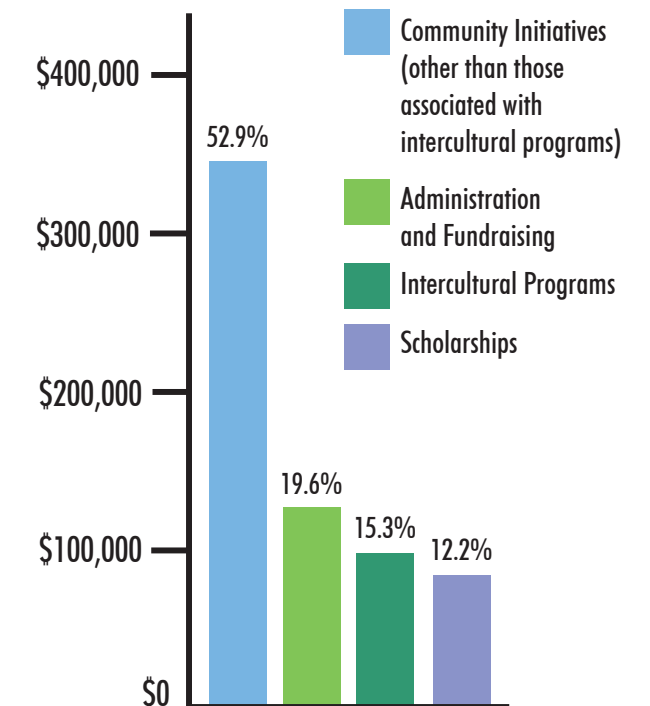


Assets as of January 1, 2022: \$1,031,410
