



West Covina Elks Veterans Corner

As we begin this new year of 2021/2022, our Veterans Committee wish our members to continue with good health.

This past year was a struggle for so many, but we still managed to serve our homeless Veterans and also 3 Veteran Facilities in our SGV and Women's Closet for Veterans in Long Beach. Thanks to Veronica Aslan and Irene Lozano and all Volunteers (West Covina and Duarte Lodges) joined forces with the \$10,000.00 Focus Grant which served the 3 Veteran Facility and the Freedom Grant of \$2,500.00 that served the Veteran Women in Long Beach.

Our Committee received the Beacon Grant in the amount of \$3,500.00 to fulfill the Welcome Home Baskets. Thanks to Grand Lodge ENF providing the funds and support.

This year we have applied for the Focus Grant and Approved in the amount of \$9,000.00 to assist 25 Senior Disabled Veterans with low income, who are housed at the Palo Verde Veteran Apartments in El Monte. We will assist with Summer and Winter clothing, tennis shoes, boxes filled with food items, pots/pans and other kitchenware. We will deliver items within 4 events, July, August, October and November. Dates of these deliveries will be announced as soon as the become available.

On June 1, 2021 we will also apply for the Beacon Grant merged with the Spotlight Grant, this will continue the Partnership with Team AmVets, providing the Welcome Home Baskets to Homeless Veterans that are places in housing and in a safe environment. If approved this will be the start of our 5th year in Partnership with Team AmVets, which has been proven to be a very successful program honoring and assisting our Veterans. This past year was a struggle due to Covid 19 Pandemic; we only did 5 one on one deliveries. We prepared the remaining baskets of 20 and Team AmVets picked them up and have already delivered several to our Veterans.

November 13, 2021 we will have our Veterans Dance, all proceeds after expenses will fund our Veterans Account. At a later date we will ask our membership for donated items that will be raffled at this event. Past generosity has been overwhelming and very much appreciated. Our Committee thanks you wholeheartedly.


