If You Are Saved, Why Don't You Act Like It?

A.W. Tozer once said, "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us." I believe that's true—but I'd add this: the second most important thing is what we think God thinks about us.

Too often, there's a gap between what we say we believe and how we actually live. Many of us proclaim that we are saved by grace, but our daily actions don't always reflect the new life we've been given in Christ. That's the heartbeat of the question: If you are saved, why don't you act like it?

1. Why Don't You Act Like This World Is Not Your Home?

Jesus said in Matthew 6:19–21 (NLT), "Don't store up treasures here on earth...store your treasures in heaven." Yet many of us live as though this world is permanent. We pour our energy into temporary things—status, stuff, success—while forgetting we're only passing through. Faith reminds us to hold loosely to the things of this world and invest in what lasts forever.

2. Why Don't You Act Like You Are Loved?

In the story of the prodigal son, both brothers misunderstood the father's love. One thought he could earn it, the other thought he had lost it. But the father poured out His love on both. In the same way, we often live like we have to fight for God's approval or fear we've fallen too far. The truth is, His love is extravagant, unchanging, and excessive. Acting saved means living daily with the assurance that we are deeply loved children of God.

3. Why Don't You Act Like You Are Free?

Paul reminds us in Galatians 5:1 (NLT), "Christ has truly set us free. Now make sure that you stay free, and don't get tied up again in slavery to the law." Too many believers walk around in old grave clothes, chained by guilt, fear, or comparison. But Jesus didn't just save us from something—He saved us for something: a life of freedom in Him.

Living the Question

The Emmaus Walk is often described as a "mountaintop experience." But the real test comes in the valley—back in our homes, workplaces, and churches. Acting like we are saved isn't about perfection; it's about transformation. It's about living as though the Gospel is true, not only on Sunday, but on Monday morning when the alarm clock goes off.

So let me ask you—if you are saved, what needs to change in your life so that your actions reflect your faith? What step will you take this week to live out the love, freedom, and hope Christ has already given you?

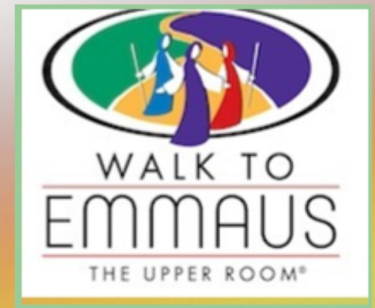
Agape Needed!

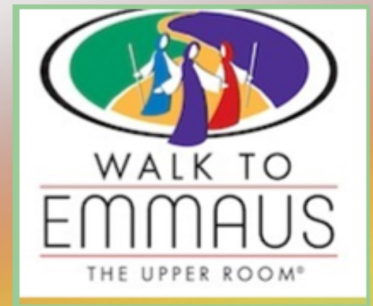
