"The greatest legacy one can pass on to one's children and grandchildren is not money or other material things accumulated in one's life, but rather a legacy of character and faith." -Billy Graham

Seasons come and seasons go...

...in Nature, in our lives, in the calendar of The Church.

And these cyclical changes often bring with them reflections on the past, as well as dreams for the future.

"When they were together for the *last* time they asked, 'Master, are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel now? Is this the time?'

He told them, 'You don't get to know the time. Timing is the Father's business. What you'll get is the Holy Spirit. **And when the Holy Spirit** comes on you, you will be able to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, all over Judea and Samaria, even to the ends of the world.

These were his *last* words. As they watched, he was taken up and disappeared in a cloud."

-Acts 1:6-9 (Eugene Peterson's "THE MESSAGE" paraphrase)

In my own mind, the end of Spring and the beginning of Summer (the wrap-up of Eastertide and the forthcoming celebration of Pentecost) give me occasion to consider what we leave behind when we move on. Whether it is due to remembrances such as Memorial Day, the contemplation generated by graduates leaving one phase of their lives for the next, or the meditation which arises from the annual recollection of the Resurrected Christ ascending into Heaven -this time of year causes me to be especially thoughtful about how our pasts and present (will) impact someone else's future.

When I was preparing for this past month's Memorial Day Weekend worship and I was reflecting upon the list of the names of our congregation's beloved deceased military members, I was hit hard by the recognition that in just 6 years' time as your pastor, I have officiated the Homegoing of NINE parishioners who were veterans (that doesn't even begin to scratch the surface of the number of other saints who we commended to GOD's Eternal Care). And this got me thinking about the impact —the LEGACY that our dearly departed labored to leave behind for us, and for the generations to follow.

Were it not for the faithfulness, the hard work, the generosity, creativity, and vision of those who went before, where would our faith-community be today?

As the saying goes around patriotic remembrances: "We may not **know** them all, but we **owe** them all."

"Carve your name on hearts, not tombstones. A legacy is etched into the minds of others and the stories they share about you." -Shannon Adler And I would add: "We may not *know* those who are coming up in our footsteps, but we **owe** them a path worth following -an inheritance which equips them to do so as effectively and faithfully as our forebearers did (for us)."

Now, this doesn't mean we can possibly foresee how culture, technology, and so forth will transform in the years to come, but it also doesn't mean we can neglect the **primary mission** (beyond our own salvation and sanctification journeys) of Jesus' followers: to make disciples of every nation, tribe and tongue.

More than bricks-and-mortar, beyond programs and events, past the shifting tastes and conventions about worship styles, our call and privilege is to receive the empowerment of The Holy Spirit in order to then witness to others about GOD's Redeeming Love.

That's why it is so wonderful that this local congregation has spent so much time and effort over (at least) the last 9 years developing our Core Values, Mission, and Vision Statements. These items reflect not only *applied* gratitude for the contributions of previous generations, but have also been purposefully/prayerfully designed to guide RUCC into future faithfulness —no matter what tomorrow holds. There's an understanding implicit in them that, once we've been saved and accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior, then it "stops being about us". There's an inherit appreciation for BOTH "where we've come from" and "where The LORD might yet be leading us". There's great care and attention given to what is truly important to this particular faith-family, while also clinging to the central-tenets of biblical Christianity.

One of the 'tag-lines' of our monthly, experimental worship-gathering (The Underground) is: "It's not a moment; it's a MOVEMENT." This is due, in part, to the understanding that the only way we can achieve any goal is to be disciplined and regular in our commitment to it—to make the goal a priority in our lives (if we truly value it). Rarely will a "one-off" event make a lasting difference. At the same time, the goal must be served by the structures which support it—not the other way around. So, just like Jesus entrusting the birthing of The Kingdom to his disciples (in his physical absence); and just like they developed new strategies and systems to fulfill his call upon them, so too must we (continue) to leave a FLEXIBLE Legacy-in-The-LORD for those entrusted to our evangelistic efforts and spiritual-formation practices.

I can't say what will be said about me after I finally face my Maker. There's no way of telling what fruit my contributions will bear when I'm gone from this world,

but two things I KNOW...

- 1.) Any earthly earnings I might acquire can't "go with me."
- 2.) I want my life to be a blessing to those "behind" me.

Thank GOD for those members who, for generations before us, made it a point to think about what kind of a church they were leaving for those of us who followed! As we celebrate their lasting legacies, let's (as we continually do around here) keep asking ourselves how we might best share The Good News and prepare a path for the people who will inherit this mission from us in the years to come...

One way to do that is to attend The Underground on June 16th, when we will be looking at the theme "Troubles and Testimonies", as well as evaluating what comes next for this particular ministry of Richville.

In the meantime, enjoy your Summer &, never forget: I am, as always...




