The National Executive (NEC) and National Business/Audit

Committee met in Tulsa March 4-7, 2020. We had a lot of business to discuss and 30 motions to approve. Our budget is taking a big hit this year due to the storm/ water damage at National Headquarters. The NEC is proposing a \$10 National dues increase to build reserve funds to meet expenses over the next five years.

This proposal will be presented to the Board of Directors and members at the 2020 National Convention. If approved, the proposed dues increase will take effect in 2021-2022.

The Five-year Strategic Plan (S.W.O.C. Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities, & Challenges) for National Kappa Kappa lota was approved by the NEC at the March Business Meeting. The Strategic Plan will be presented to the Board of Directors and members at the 2020 National Convention. I want to thank the NEC, all State Presidents, guests, and Dr. Mitzy Johnson-Mills for all the hard work that took place at the Fall Meeting to make this a reality. (Strategic Plan on page 4)

"Read to Grow" A New Reality in Bartow County, GA By Janet Martin, Tau Chapter, Lambda State/GA

A new day and a new program is now a reality in Georgia's Bartow County Schools (BCS). In 2018 a group of business leaders, educators, and clergy came together to discuss issues which were negatively affecting academic life of students in Bartow County. During that discussion, one of the educators in the group, Dr. Davis Nelson, a former First Grade Teacher, Principal, Superintendent, Elected County School Board Member and County School Board Chair; stated that a child who learns to read in grades 1-3 will be better able to face all academics and will likely stay in school and graduate. And, other statistics say that a child who drops out of school in ninth grade, will make \$19,000 per year less than a

High School graduate, and will be more likely to go on food stamps, more likely to go on welfare, or more likely to wind up in the prison system.

A newly hired BCS Superintendent, Dr. Phillip Paige, was approached with the idea that reading achievement in grades 1-3 was critical to a student's academic and life success. This new Superintendent immediately understood the crisis and the task of making reading achievement in the grades 1-3 a priority in all BCS. He developed a Task Force Committee, who reached out to the community to seek adult volunteers to go into all BCS and work with students struggling with 270 key sight words. Task Force Members trained the volunteers and now there are over 600 volunteer adults working with students in grades 1-12. The volunteers encourage students to keep practicing their sight words and celebrate progress with students.

The BCS reading achievement data available for first grade students in December 2019, showed these students reading on average, 62 more sight words that they were reading in the beginning of the 2019 school year. The BCS system average was a high of 99 more sight words being read by students in grades 1-2! I am a substitute volunteer. I volunteer and work in any BCS classroom in grades 1-2. If you would like to make a difference in the life of a child, struggling to learn to read, I highly recommend that you go into a classroom and work with young students. If you are currently involved as a volunteer in any kind of reading program, know that you are making a difference in the life of a child. This service reaps a huge blessing!

Strategic Goal 1 (MEMBERSHIP): To increase, retain and reinstate a diversified organization

Objective 1: Expand membership opportunities to all professional educational personnel by 10% per year per state

Objective 2: Retain current members through incentive award(s) with five years or more (10, 15, 20, 25, etc.) of membership

Objective 3: Retain reinstated former members and current members at a rate of 95% annually

Strategic Goal 2 (PERSONAL & PROFESSIONAL GROWTH): To explore a variety of resources to offer appealing programs for personal and professional growth

Objective 1: Develop a list of programs for personal and professional growth through National Kappa Kappa lota

Objective 2: Solicit a list of topics of interest from members and compile a list of popular topics from which to offer meeting programs as evidenced from a local chapter survey

Strategic Goal 3 (PUBLICITY/PROMOTION): To promote awareness of Kappa Kappa lota and showcase activities through all possible avenues of publicity

Objective 1: Increase the level of publicity on the national website, social media, and local media outlets such as YouTube videos, commercials, and local newspaper articles

Strategic Goal 4 (REVENUE EXPANSION): To investigate opportunities to generate increased funding resources and donations for revenue expansion and sustainability

Objective 1: Identify at least two grant opportunities for non-profit organizations and apply for these by National Kappa Kappa lota

Objective 2: Provide online: dues payment, fund-raising monies, donations and endowments to generate additional revenues by \$25K

Strategic Goal 5 (SERVICE): To encourage and expand service opportunities

Objective 1: Have at least one philanthropic activity each year by local chapter

Objective 2: Document better and share service activities by all chapters and states

Objective 3: Promote the awareness of a variety of service opportunities available to members at all levels and increase participation in these service events using social media, local news outlets, and websites

Objective 4: Encourage scholarship qualified applicants to pursue local, state, and national scholarships prior to deadlines each year

These goals and objectives will be reviewed annually at the local, state, and national level to determine how we are meeting each goal. A form was created that will be in the 2020-2021 State Presidents' Packet. The purpose of this form will be to remind each State President to provide details about how they are meeting the Strategic Plan Goals for their year-end reporting to National
