ONLINE BILL PAYMENT NOW AVAILABLE

The District is partnering with Allpaid to enable online utility payments through: <https://allpaid.com/>

You can use this simple online method to pay your District utility bill. The cost (fee) of using this service is 2.25% per (self-pay) transaction. Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Discover Card credit and debit cards are accepted.

To make an online utility payment, go to <https://allpaid.com/> and enter *a004k1* or *Resort Improvement District* in the search box below 'Make a Payment' and click 'Get Started.' You will confirm the payment selection (for Resort Improvement District) by clicking on 'Pay This Destination.'

To complete an online payment, you will need your utility account number (located on the top left, second line of your utility bill) and the service street address. The District's website will also link to Allpaid's website.

You can still make a utility payment in all the classic ways... via USPS, at the District Office in person or through the slot in the front door or over the phone by calling the District office (over the phone payments will incur a 3% service charge).

Utility Capacity Charge Payment Assistance Program

The District is excited to announce this new program that will allow for individuals and businesses to pay utility capacity charges for new electric, water, and sewer connections interest free for up to three years. Individuals and businesses are required to apply, pay a \$100 admin fee, a credit check fee, and all applicable utility connection fees to participate in the program. We are requesting customers please avoid flushing disposable wipes into the wastewater system. These are problematic as they can cause the wastewater system to backflow into homes and businesses. Please dispose of them in the garbage.

Preparedness is the Shelter Cove Way

The Shelter Cove Fire Department and CERT are encouraging residents to have their to-go-bags ready as we have already experienced wildland fires in Mendocino and Shasta counties. You can find emergency preparedness info and an emergency supplies list on our website by clicking on the CERT button.

Shelter Cove is a Firewise Community

For everything there is season and now is the time to reduce fire hazards and build fire resiliency at your home and property by clearing brush/small trees, keeping grass trimmed and limbing up large trees. Its also the time to keep our roads (evacuation routes) clear. Please relocate vehicles, boats & construction materials from Shelter Cove roads and cul-de-sacs by May 14th.

Chipper Days has returned! The next three Chipper Days will start on Monday May 24th and continue through Wednesday May 26th. Please take advantage of this incredible opportunity by moving your woody material (to be chipped) to the roadside's edge with cut butts facing out. Please do not stack limbs over 5 ft high – just start a new pile. Tree trunks, stumps, rotten wood, rocks, and garbage cannot be chipped. Contact Shelter Cove Fire at 986-7507 or scfd@sheltercove-ca.gov for an application form and let us know when your pile is ready to be chipped. Being recognized as a Firewise Community helps reduce fire insurance costs for Shelter Cove homeowners. You can download a Shelter Cove Firewise certificate from the District's website to provide to your home insurer.

Closure of Burn Season Imminent

The end of the burning season will soon be announced by the State. Once the closure is announced all burning must cease.

Fire Extinguisher Recharge

The community may bring their fire extinguishers to the Fire House or District office on the morning of Thursday, June 10th, for recharging by Eureka-Humboldt Fire Extinguisher. If you have any questions, please call them at 822-2517. The cost of this service depends on unit size. One time use only extinguishers cannot be recharged.

Water Conservation

California and our Northcoast region are currently in a state of drought. The District wants to encourage all Shelter Cove residents and businesses to take time now to begin thinking about ways to reduce water use for later this summer.
