Dear Church Family,

I saw an interview this week with Aaron Rodgers, quarterback for the Green Bay Packers. In it he discussed his personal struggle with faith, particularly as it related to the beliefs of his parents. He referenced the contradiction that God's love is for everyone, yet some believe that only 144,000 will go to heaven.

The idea of the 144,000 is an interesting one to be sure. Some denominations take a literal interpretation of the passage in the book of Revelations that speaks about it. The number is taken by saying that the Apostle John saw in a vision 12,000 people from each of the 12 tribes of Israel standing before the throne of God. Many people who like that passage seem to stop reading before they get to the verses listed above.

As the passage concludes John states that there is an ever greater multitude from all nations also standing there with them. I think that is a beautiful picture because it speaks to the greater family of God that we all belong to.

It can be easy, I think, to get so caught up in our own daily struggles that we forget about how we are part of a greater story, a greater family, a greater church. The Greek word for church is actually "ekklesia" which translates to mean "community." While the kingdom of God is made up of little communities everywhere, they are also part of a greater community that makes up the universal church.

At Forest Hills our community has a great story, and it is made up of great people, who have accomplished great things. But that is not the story in its entirety. Our story and our community is made up of people who may have never walked into our sanctuary or worshiped with us. It is made up of people who attend AA, play in our gym, or serve in the Boy Scouts.

Over the course of the next couple of months we are going to be participating in a denominational process called Vital Congregations that will help us see how we can play a relevant role in the greater community around us. In doing so we will hopefully see how God's kingdom and our "ekklesia" reaches farther out than we could possibly imagine. In the weeks ahead as we discuss more ways to participate in this process, I hope that you will join us to speak, listen, and act in ways that benefit the entire Kingdom of God.
