
Mark 1:15 quotes Jesus as saying, "Repent, and believe in the gospel." Since the Gospels hadn't been written yet, what was he referring to?

These days when we say the word *gospel*, we tend to be talking about one of the four written Gospels of the New Testament: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. But the word *gospel* wasn't originally tied to any particular

written form of communication. In fact, the Greek word we translate to gospel—evangelion—simply means "good news."

When Jesus says, "Repent and believe in the gospel," he is basically saying, "Repent and believe in the good news." For Jesus, the nature of that good news is clear: Jesus is announcing the coming of God's kingdom, the initiation of the fullness of God's reign on earth. Jesus preaches this good news in word and action and makes it real through his life, death, and resurrection.

After Jesus' resurrection and ascension, many of his followers

Today's Gospel

Today we begin a continuous reading of Mark's Gospel that will carry us through this segment of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. Remember that in Cycle B of the Lectionary, most of the Gospel readings are taken from the Gospel according to Mark.

The Gospel of Mark does not begin with a narrative about Jesus' birth. Instead Mark begins by reporting on the preaching of John the Baptist. John is described as the voice in the wilderness sent to prepare the way of the Lord. Immediately after describing the work of John the Baptist, Mark reports on Jesus' baptism and his temptation in the desert. Jesus' public ministry begins after the arrest of John the Baptist. Mark wants his readers to understand the important connection between the end of the ministry of John the Baptist and the beginning of Jesus' own ministry.

As we learn at the beginning of today's Gospel reading, Jesus preaches the Kingdom of God in continuity with the preaching of John the Baptist. Like John the Baptist, Jesus' pronouncement of the kingdom is a call to repentance. Yet Jesus' preaching is greater than John's. Jesus begins the time of fulfillment; the Kingdom of God is already here. This will be demonstrated again and again, both in Jesus' words and in the actions that follow. Jesus' healings and forgiveness of sins are signs of the Kingdom of God that he announces in his teaching.

In contrast to last week's Gospel, in Mark's Gospel Jesus takes the initiative in calling his first disciples. As mentioned last week, it was more typical of first-century rabbinical schools for students to seek out rabbis, asking to be their disciples. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus breaks with this tradition and invites his disciples to learn from him. Jesus is said to have first called four fishermen—Simon, Andrew, James, and John. Simon and Andrew are brothers. Jesus promises that he will make them "fishers of men." James and John are also brothers. Mark does not report Jesus' words of invitation to them, but he does report that they left their fishing immediately; their father, Zebedee, was left behind in the boat.

Mark's Gospel is told with a great sense of urgency and immediacy. Jesus is a person of action, and events occur in rapid succession. We see this in today's Gospel. Time is of the essence; the fishermen immediately put aside their livelihood to become Jesus' disciples. The Kingdom of God is here and now. The time of fulfillment is at hand. INCOMES to OUTCOMES

The Fiscal/Budget Year for the St. Vincent de Paul Society runs from October 1 through the following September 30 each year. After compiling our budget and service outcomes these last months of 2020, we once again are happy to report both a growth in contributions and service funds which were even more in demand as we encountered the serious needs of families and individuals facing loss of income and benefits as the Covid-19 virus began to rage through our world. In reviewing the data to compile this report we were amazed as our donations rose seemingly miraculously as the needs of those we help likewise grew. In the April-June quarter the needs shifted from water & other utility bills to rental and mortgage help while jobs or hours of paid work continued to disappear for many. With the transfers of school-age and day care children back to their homes, even more requests for income help poured in. Many elderly found their lives threatened by the pandemic as their children and grandchildren sought refuge in their homes – again with limited household resources. A round of Stimulus Payments temporarily relieved some of the needs in mid-summer but by August the virus raged on while economic solutions were not at all available for most.

However, due to the benevolence of our parishioners, friends and the prayers of many, we moved through this pandemic period and continue to the present with the protection and confidence that this, too, will be resolved with the love and guidance of God.

Our Fiscal Year 2020 picture in more detail showed the following:

FUNDS: Available on Oct. 1, 2019: \$11,265.

Collected/donated during FY2020: \$31,524.

Distributed to recipients in Fiscal Yr. 2020: \$32,957.

FUNDS: Available on Oct. 1, 2020: \$9,832.

In next week's Bulletin, we will list how our funding was used both directly to clients for bills and their living expenses as well as the commodities and goods we provided directly to those in need. These included food, clothing, medicines, transportation, car repairs, fees for licenses, gasoline/fuel, etc. We continue to provide for the basic needs of the poor. All of us provide the prayers needed.



SAINTS OF THE WEEK




JANUARY 25: St. Paul the Apostle was the greatest of the early Christian missionaries. He first appears in the Acts of the Apostles under the name of Saul. Saul was raised in the Jewish faith as a Pharisee trained in the strict observance of God's Law. He believed the Law

should be obeyed by himself and all Jews. Saul was upset by the early Christian Church, believing that the early Christians had broken away from their Jewish traditions.

Paul then traveled to Damascus to further persecute early Christians. On the road to Damascus Saul had an encounter with the Risen Jesus Christ (Acts of the Apostles 9:1–19, Galatians 1: 13-14). Jesus asked, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Paul replied, "Who are you, sir?" Jesus responded, "I am Jesus whom you are persecut-(Acts 9: 4-5). Jesus then sent Saul into Damascus to wait for further instructions. Saul was shaken and blinded by the experience.

When a Christian named Ananias came and baptized Saul, his blindness went away. As a result of this encounter Saul became a follower of Christ. He was now convinced that fellowship with the risen Jesus Christ, not the observance of the Law, was all that was needed to receive God's promise of salvation. (Galatians 1:11-12; 3:1-5)

JANUARY 28: By universal consent, Thomas Aguinas is the preeminent spokesman of the Catholic tradition of reason and of divine revelation. He is one of the great teachers of the medieval Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church, honored with the titles Doctor of the Church and Angelic Doctor.

At five he was given to the Benedictine monastery at Monte Cassino in his parents' hopes that he would choose that way of life and eventually became abbot. In 1239, he was sent to Naples to complete his studies. It was here that he was first attracted to Aristotle's philosophy.

By 1243, Thomas abandoned his family's plans for him and joined the Dominicans, much to his mother's dismay. On her order, Thomas was captured by his brother and kept at home for over a year.

Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, pervades his writings. "He died March 7, 1274.




