## COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

In 2020 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:

- Began construction on a new Health Center in Sal, Mali.
- Community members and students from Northeastern University worked together to plaster and paint the community center in Gualapuro, Ecuador.
- Provided paint and supplies for the Health Center in Gualsaqui, Ecuador.

## EDUCATION

**In 2020 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:**

- Tommo So Literacy program for 300 women in Mali.
- Student Mothers Program in Mali that allowed 21 young mothers to continue to pursue their education.
- Secondary Education Scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 100 students to attend high school. 20 students graduated this year!
- Higher Education Scholarships in Ecuador that allowed 17 students to attend universities and technical institutes. 5 Students graduated this year!
- The first ever Virtual Summer School Program for 20 students in Ecuador exclusively on Zoom. We also provided internet access for students.
- Supporting a teacher for the elementary school in Yarou Plateau, Mali.
- Donation of 4 laptop computers and the repair of 6 laptop computers and 1 printer for the computer lab at the school in Urkusiki, Ecuador.
- Donation of desks, chairs, and cabinets for the school in Andjine, Mali.

## ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION AND FOOD SECURITY

**In 2020 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:**

- Ohio Master Gardeners worked alongside Saminay High School Students in Inguincho, Ecuador to plant 1,112 ornamental plants.
- Creation of 2 School Gardens in Saredina and Ondogou, Mali.
- Support for the Olouguelemo Environmental Association, which led the following projects:
  - Representatives from 10 Olouguelemo member villages learned how to build stone contour lines to prevent erosion, then taught these techniques to other farmers.
  - Olouguelemo held a reforestation campaign, during which 1,890 trees were planted.
  - Olouguelemo members committed to practicing assisted natural regeneration, a pruning technique that encourages growth, on 7,395 trees.

“ Today, all the member villages have benefited from this training in erosion control. They practice this technique in their fields, which is different from traditional dikes and which protects the soil and the trees. Not only does it protect the soil, but the grasses also grow very quickly, which is beneficial to our animals. ”

## HEALTH CARE

**In 2020 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:**

### COVID response in Ecuador:

- Provided 1,000 tubes and 500 swabs for COVID-19 testing to the Ministry of Health.
- Provided medications, supplies, and PPE to 2 health centers and 1 hospital including 200 disposable masks, 100 KN95 masks and 40 fluid resistant isolation gowns.
- Funded transportation for staff from 2 health centers to visit the communities for which they are responsible to provide care to 335 patients and deliver medications.
- Provided food baskets to 673 families particularly affected by the pandemic.
- Provided 1,280 masks to members of 21 communities.
- Provided 3 education sessions that benefited 88 people in 18 different communities.

### COVID response in Mali:

- Installed 80 large hand wash stations at health centers, schools, mosques, churches, bus stations, and other public places.
- Provided supplies and PPE for 5 health centers and 1 hospital.
- Hosted 530 education sessions in 82 villages on preventing the spread of the virus.
- Provided 570 small hand wash setups for women's associations, other groups, and families.
- Distributed 1,200 masks.
- Produced and broadcast a radio program about preventing the spread of COVID.



### Patient Follow Up Program in Ecuador

- 121 patients received support with medical follow up care.
- 54 patients received support with vision follow up care.
- 13 patients received glasses.
- 2 patients accessed surgeries.
- 1 patient received hearing aids.
- 1 patient received an eye prosthesis

## INCOME GENERATION

**In 2020 we were proud to be a part of the following projects:**

- 30 new Savings for Change groups started in Mali with 681 women members.
- 26 experienced Savings for Change members learned how to become replicators, creating new groups and supporting them as they learn how to manage their group funds.
- 5 women's associations received startup funding for businesses in indigo dying, sheep husbandry, and market gardening.



“Today I am thrilled to be able to reimburse the sheep loan that I received thanks to the financial support of the Tandana Foundation and its partners, following the competition between the various women's associations for Tandana's enterprise support fund. 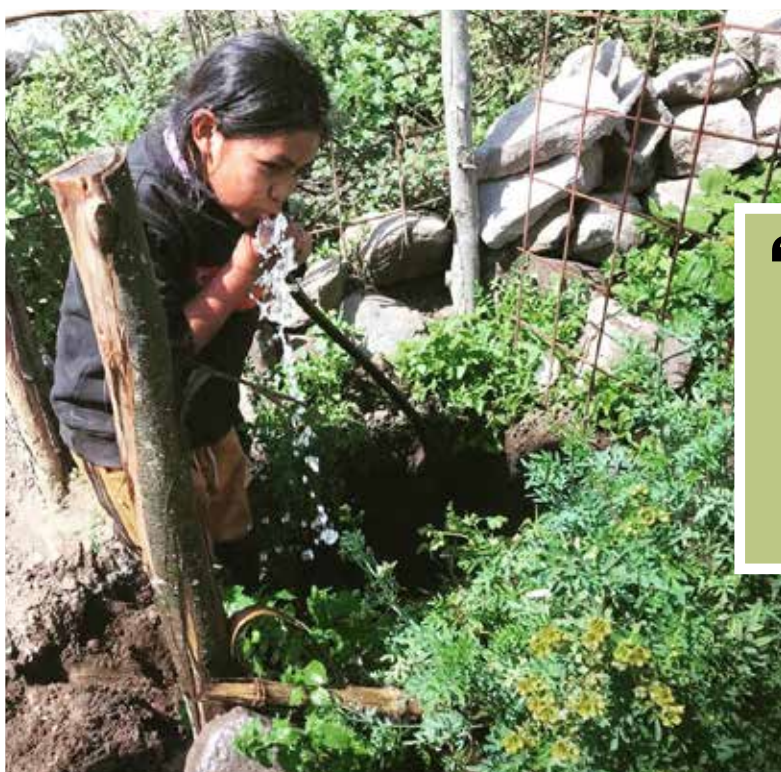

- Digging a trench for a potable water system in La Banda, Ecuador with students from Saline High School.

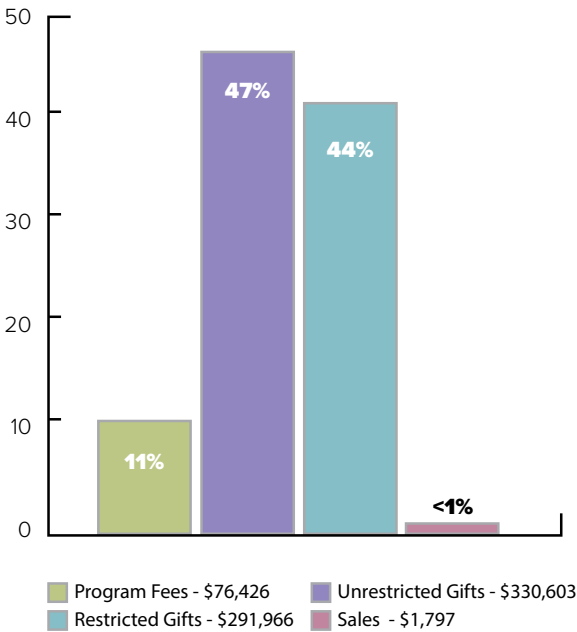

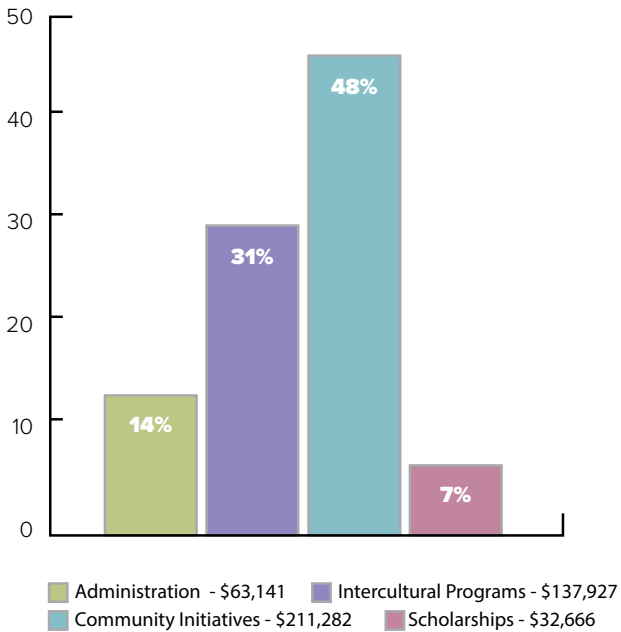
