Chad reviewed the minutes from the Information & Education committee meeting held July 2nd. The committee heard proposals for web design from three firms, Unanimous, Kevin Brown Design and RedThread. Discussion was held on the proposals.

WATER COMMITTEE REPORT

Tyler updated the Board on efforts to find additional funding for flow meter cost share including an application for NRCS Regional Conservation Partnership Funding, Bureau of Reclamation Grant, and the Water Resources Cash Fund.

Tyler summarized the recent AEM flights. Due to fuel and mobilization savings from combined projects, an additional 94 line miles were flown, in total 525 miles were flown.

Discussion was held on the proposed groundwater rules and regulations. Duane Parde submitted a letter to the Board with his comments on the proposed rules.

NRD ACTIVITIES

Recently, there was a large fish kill at Big Indian. Nebraska Game and Parks has attributed this to clear water and high temperatures causing a large algal growth. Subsequent cooler temperatures caused the growth to die, resulting in depleted oxygen levels.

Scott Theis discussed recent damage to the guard rail at Big Indian. The individual responsible has been billed by the NRD for the required repair.

Pictures of newly constructed playgrounds at Willard Meyer and Cub Creek were shown.

Scott told the Board that he has been asked to attend the Gage County Planning and Zoning meeting on August 15th. The expansion of the Beatrice Wellhead Protection Area will be discussed.

Scott reviewed NARD Hall of Fame nominations with the board.

HUSKER HARVEST DAYS

Scott asked for volunteers to attend Husker Harvest Days to work in the NARD booth. Three Directors expressed interest in attending.
