Jeannene Farrow Caesar, affectionately known as “Mama Nene”, was born on October 6, 1943 in Winston-Salem, NC to the late Lelia and James Henry Farrow. She was educated in the local public schools and was a graduate of Winston-Salem State University. While a student there, she blossomed and became lead soloist for the college choir under the direction of Dr. James A. Dillard. Singing was her gift. Receiving the gift of her voice was always a pleasure.

She was a teacher at Bolton Elementary School for 35 years before retiring. While there, because of her skills, she received the designation of Master Teacher. Additionally, “Mama Nene”, a veteran third grade teacher, was voted Teacher of the Year for the 1998-99 school year. She believed that all children are a gift and that it is a teacher’s responsibility to help shape the future by teaching children not only academics but character, dignity and self-worth.

“Mama Nene” accepted Jesus Christ at an early age and was a faithful and active member of St. Paul United Methodist Church. She was also a former member of United Metropolitan Baptist Church. With a true love for singing, without hesitation, she shared her gift as a member and soloist of the Contemporary Gospel Choir.

Called home to sing in the heavenly choir on Monday, January 18, 2021, the mark that “Mama Nene” left on everyone as a mother, sister, wife and friend will live forever in many hearts. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her sister, Sandra Havner.
